Subject: SCAG Scholarship Program

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Recommend one (1) student each from Imperial, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Ventura Counties, and two (2) students from Los Angeles County, to receive the 2018 SCAG Scholarship Program Award. The Scholarship Committee may, at their discretion (not compulsory), recommend two (2) additional students—from any SCAG county—to also receive a scholarship award. Recommendations will be forwarded to the Regional Council for approval at their next regular meeting on June 7, 2018.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The SCAG Scholarship Committee was formed by the Regional Council to evaluate submitted applications for the SCAG Scholarship Program, the purpose of which is to provide financial support to a select group of high school and community college students and offer local planning experience that students can use to develop their long-term career goals. This year, SCAG received forty-four (44) applications in total, and twenty (20) of those have been forwarded to the Scholarship Committee for further evaluation. The Scholarship Committee has been asked to recommend one student each from Imperial, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Ventura Counties and two (2) students from Los Angeles County, to receive the 2018 SCAG Scholarship Program Award. The Scholarship Committee may, at their discretion (not compulsory), recommend two (2) additional students—from any SCAG county—to also receive a scholarship award.

STRATEGIC PLAN:

This item supports SCAG's Strategic Plan, Goal 2: Advance Southern California's policy interests and planning priorities through regional, statewide, and national engagement and advocacy.

BACKGROUND:

In July 2009, the Regional Council approved the SCAG Scholarship Pilot Program, which is intended to provide financial support to a select group of high school and community college students and offer local planning experience that students can use to develop their long-term career goals. Now in its seventh year, the program is open to high school juniors and seniors and community college students who reside in the six-county SCAG region. Students applying are required to have a minimum 3.0 grade point average and must provide proof of enrollment in higher education (if graduating). As part of the application, students are required to submit a completed application form; a minimum 500-word essay, describing their interests in urban planning and public policy; two (2) letters of recommendation; and a current transcript of records. In addition to a monetary award of \$4,000, recipients will also participate in a two-week internship with SCAG or a local planning agency. The purpose of the internship is to introduce students to a career in urban planning and local government,



and scholarship recipients will be expected to perform light office work and attend meetings with a designated mentor.

SCAG received a total of forty-four (44) applications from throughout the SCAG region, of which thirty-one (31) were completed online. There were four (4) total applications from Imperial County, twenty-four (24) from Los Angeles County, four (4) from Orange County, four (4) from Riverside County, four (4) from San Bernardino County, and four (4) from Ventura County. Applications were screened based on the minimum requirements and on the interests described in the essay portion. Although a majority of the applicants met the minimum requirements, those students that exhibited some interest in planning, public policy, and/or government were selected to be forwarded to the Scholarship Committee.

Staff has forwarded twenty (20) applications, consisting of two (2) from Imperial County, seven (7) from Los Angeles County, three (3) from Orange County, three (3) from Riverside County, two (2) from San Bernardino County, and three (3) from Ventura County, to the Scholarship Committee for further evaluation. The Scholarship Committee is asked to evaluate the applications and recommend one (1) finalist each from Imperial, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Ventura Counties, and two (2) finalists from Los Angeles County. The Scholarship Committee may, at their discretion (not compulsory), recommend two (2) additional students—from any SCAG county—to also receive a scholarship award. Recommendations will be forwarded to the Regional Council for approval at their next regular meeting on June 7, 2018.

It is suggested that the Scholarship Committee consider the interests of the students in their respective essays, career goals, and activities in each student's school and surrounding community when evaluating the applications. Names and other personal identifiers have been removed (to the greatest extent possible) from the applications, essays, letters of recommendation, transcripts, and other supporting documents in order to protect the privacy of the students, though each forwarded application has been assigned a number for reference. In following practice from prior years, selection of recommended finalists will be via Committee consensus.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The SCAG Scholarship Program cost would be a minimum of \$28,000, or a maximum of \$36,000 if two additional scholarships are awarded. Funds are included in the FY 2017-2018 General Fund Budget.

Civic Leadership Institute

I studied urban situations and poverty in Chicago, Illinois for 3 weeks as a part of the Civic Education Project sponsored by Northwestern University. Utilizing my studies, I went out into the city and participated daily in service events as well as interfaced with people who studied the urban population of the city. The service events in which I participated included (i) working at multiple children's centers in which children, whose parents were down on their luck, were placed to spend each day, (ii) cooked food and served it at a soup kitchen to those less fortunate, (iii) worked in a community garden to help beautify the city, and (iv) interviewed urban dwellers, listening to their complaints, and discussing such with my supervisor as a means to bring their issues to the attention of the city in the hope of a mutual resolution. Additionally, I discussed the topic of wrongful convictions with a local law firm.

One Generation

One Generation is an intergenerational center. I provided meals for homebound seniors, meaning I had to shop for seniors who did not have family support or could not leave their homes. Once a week, I would go to a grocery store with a shopping list that a senior citizen provided for me and would deliver it to their home.

Operation Gratitude

Through this program, I made care packages for soldiers overseas that included letters and paracord bracelets that I had to make.

New Horizons

New Horizons is a center for adults with special needs. Once a month, the adults would be brought on buses to this center for social events. I baked dozens of cookies that they would eat, assisted in setting up for the event and cleaning the facility, helped cook food in the kitchen and serve it at dinner time, and, most importantly socialized with the special needs adults throughout the night

Special Olympics

I have assisted in the Special Olympics through both the National Charity League and with my school continuously since 2012. In the National Charity League, I participated in Special Olympics bowling and managed the participants to ensure they were in the proper events. Through my school, I was a Bull-Pen manager and an Awards Manager meaning I oversaw all of the events that went on and aided the athletes in completing their events.

My interest in public service and urban affairs first began when I was fourteen and was accepted to Mayor Garcetti's Youth Council. From that moment, I looked at the city of Los Angeles and its many neighborhoods, communities and citizens in a different light. My earliest experience with the Youth Council was attending the "Raise the Wage" campaign with Mayor Garcetti where I learned how a few more dollars of income could have a dramatic and life changing effect on families and their ability to survive. Hearing their personal stories and reflecting on their individual hopes and dreams, I knew then that I wanted to work and be part of the process that impacted the lives of the urban population. That same month, I attended the Young s Political Conference at the University of Southern California. For eight hours, I sat in the Radisson Hotel listening to panelists of and student government leaders talk about their commitment mayors, city council to civic engagement and public planning. Thoroughly invested and compelled to become more civically involved, I formed a relationship with the director of the school of political science at the University of Southern California, Dan Schnur. That summer, I assisted him at the HOPE Conference, where came to represent the Latina community by seeking ways to become more involved in public policy. I witnessed the process these took to become civically involved as well as hearing their stories of the time spent

and the setbacks they experienced before they knew what they wanted to do. After learning more about the journey, I was surer than ever that this was what I wanted to do. Mr. Schnur gave me the opportunity to be an unpaid intern in Councilmember Bob Blumenfield's office where I reviewed and edited spreadsheets. After that summer, I attended the Young

s Political Conference for a second time, but this time, I was invited by the student directors of the programs to work more events on campus. I continued to do service

through National Charity League and the Mayor's Youth Council as well as managing the Special Olympics, but I craved civic engagement. That summer, I decided to take an even bigger step towards my goal. For 3 weeks, I lived in Chicago and through Northwestern's Civic Education Project, I studied poverty, homelessness, and urban life in Chicago as well as engaging in hands-on projects. That summer changed my life; it was the most directly involved I had ever been in urban planning. I wrote to Mr. Schnur telling him how much I had learned and how driven I had become to make this a reality. He invited me to be s Political Conference. I was honored to receive this panelist at the next Young opportunity, but also confused because the panelists in the past were already in college or already had met their career goals. I asked him why only a sixteen-year-old who was not as accomplished, would be valuable to hear from. He responded that my very journey of realizing my career as well as my various experiences in urban planning could inspire another young to realize passion and also fall in love with public policy and civil service the way I had. When I arrived at my third Young s Political Conference, there was a placard with my name on it onstage among the other panelists. I thought back to where I was two years ago, sitting in the conference, unsure of what I wanted and reflected on my personal journey to becoming a panelist. I was happy to share my journey with the other teenagers and adults attending the conference. It was these experiences, the people I had met through my interest in urban planning, and my community who sparked my passion furthermore. That summer, I reached out to Judge Huey Cotton and asked if I could spend a day with him and observe what he does. After that day, I had learned so much and was so excited that I emailed back and asked if I could stay for a week this time. He gave me a parking pass and told me to be there at 8 the following week. I observed civil and criminal court cases. In a human trafficking case, three of the four victims refused to testify and the one who did refused to continue. At first, I was confused as to why they were not seeking justice, but then I understood: they were afraid. I took this as a call to action, that I could be the one to end this fear. I now aspire to be a prosecutor and I hope to empower victims to use their voices and finish their fights. To best prepare myself to practice law, I plan to study political science and sociology. It is important to understand the "science" of law and human behavior to understand urban affairs and social justice. Aside from practicing law, I would like to continue volunteering with and supporting nonprofit organizations because they never stop seeking justice for others. I hope that through the SCAG program, I can meet new people as well as gain local government planning experience to expand my sphere of influence and enable me to continue along the path of civil service that I have become enamored with.

For the first seven years of my life I grew up in my hometown Albuquerque, New Mexico. The winters were very cold and the summers jumped to triple digits, so I experienced a spectrum of seasons throughout my childhood. One particular image that has been burned in my mind is the sight of brown grass everywhere I looked. The sun beated down without mercy on our front lawn, creating a very unpleasant view. For this reason alone, my parents decided to replace our front yards' withering hay with "stylish" pebbles of rocks and gravel to conserve water. We had finally become another participant in our little anti-green neighborhood, and the Home Owners Association couldn't be happier.

These memories lingered with me as my family moved out west to the green-ridden hills of California. The big city of Los Angeles was quite a breath-taker with so many commuters, events, and constant construction. California's cities are so complicated and planned with such intricate detail that I was amazed by its design. I wondered how the water and power flowed throughout the city and through such a dense commuter population. How we keep the streets clean and the water cleaner. Unfortunately, as I got busy with school and Karate, these probing questions faded away to the back of my head as things that "could be answered later". But in June of 2016, these thoughts were rekindled.

I was accepted into the Los Angeles Bureau of Sanitation's Summer Introduction to Engineering and Science Program (SITES) in coalition with LAUSD. This was an internship to gain work experience in a professional work environment with the city of Los Angeles under the mayor's office. It involved working with my project manager under the LA Sanitation department involving the purity of the water that runs throught the city, disposal of garbage along with the processes to contain ammonia buildup, and the role of Publicly Owned Treatment Works (POTW) in recycling of water. I lead one of the presentations on the routine tests that city workers conduct to survey the contents and impurities of tap water along with the criteria for the species allowed in that water. Just the complexity of the government's role in all of these public services was very interesting. What I found most intriguing though, was the processes utilized by the POTW in cleaning waste-water so that it can be recycled and put back into the environment. Some of the steps included reverse-osmosis, circular clarifiers, and solids handling. Surprisingly, most people don't know where the water goes once you flush the toilet or after washing your car, which is what the government has to handle.

This experience gave me a whole new perspective upon the role of city-workers in urban and environmental planning. For example, we led a presentation on the enrichment of the environment near the Los Angeles Zoo in which the immense parking lot was converted into a forest-like area with an underground aquifer. Large trees, bushes, and shrubs divide the lot into segments of five parking spots all surrounded by plants. This solved the most heated frustration of the hot summer sun by providing shade to almost every parking spot while promoting the environment and the collection of excess rainwater.

I'm really interested in these projects that further enrich LA and I want to contribute further in urban planning in my future career. I would like to focus on working with earthquake precaution to make sure that the city is further prepared structurally, while making sure that the environment is protected from underground sewer/oil leaks. In addition, another path I would like to take is toward water input for the city. California has been engaged in a serious drought in which every little reserve helps, like the aquifer under the LA Zoo. In this way, we can prevent the brown grass from my childhood from dominating neighborhoods. The internship with LA Sanitation has greatly inspired me toward future careers in environmental planning/engineering with the Bureau of Sanitation. I am confident that by gaining the type of first-hand experience SCAG provides, will help me achieve my goal of becoming an expert in engineering. With that knowledge, I will be able to make a difference in Los Angeles by working in an organization that is "for the people, by the people".

In exchange for security and protection, an individual who chooses to live in a society must give up certain freedoms. This is the golden social contract theory, the compromise made between a government and its people to ensure harmony and peace. It is a contract that Ukraine, although not entirely of its own fault, has broken, leaving its people in disaster.

I have not seen my family in five years, since the war started. I left my grandmother's house in 2013 knowing that I would surely be back. Just a few months later, President Viktor Yanukovych pulled out of a political and trade deal with the European Union, falling victim to Russia's powerful manipulation, erasing decades of progress, and betraying his people. Ordinary citizens, my neighbors and family, stormed the Maidan Square in the heart of Kyiv for months of protest. Many were attacked and killed by the police, the very people meant to protect them. I watched the destruction of my home from thousands of miles away in Los Angeles.

The years since have been a blur. An exiled president. Illegal annexation of Crimea. A bombed civilian airport. Nevertheless, after thousands of innocent deaths, daily violations of internationally established ceasefires, and the overflow of "unclaimed" Russian military equipment across the border, the problem runs much deeper than a local political conflict. It is a crime against humanity largely unrecognized by the international community, one that stems from a culture of corruption.

As all of this was happening, I entered my freshman year of high school full of passion and energy to make a change. However, I was met with a disappointing level of ignorance and apathy to any sort of political or world affairs from my classmates. So, Student Support Forum, a space for political discussion and debate, was born. Besides developing a community of open-minded, forward thinkers, we were able to involve the rest of the school community through collection drives and speakers. A dialogue about political injustices, such as the conflict in Ukraine, had finally been opened.

Although I was making an impact on campus, I wanted to take my interest into the rest of the world. I joined the Borgen Project team as an intern, making calls to congressmen and women and trying to pass poverty-reducing legislation. When I first went into my congressman's office to lobby a bill as a junior in high school, I realized that I really could make an impact on the course of public policy. As an American, this is seen as my right. As a Ukrainian, I also see it as a great privilege.

My senior year, I went on to intern at that congressman's office. As a prospective political science major, I always looked to D.C. and the White House to make the necessary changes needed for my community. In Congressman Sherman's office, I witnessed how local government was able to change the lives of our constituents; we held town halls to listen to concerns, brainstormed policy that affected the San Fernando Valley specifically, and, most importantly, addressed individual problems through casework.

As a Ukrainian immigrant that has witnessed crippling corruption in politics, I understand that the privilege of living in America allows me to make an impact on the lives of the people in my community and beyond through public policy. Making policy that serves everyone's best interests (not just those in politics), is the only way to a peaceful, equal society. Living here in Los Angeles has proved this mission to be a possibility. If that same standard was available to me back in Kyiv, such a drastic violation of human rights would probably not have occurred. I hope to take my global perspective and put it to work to make living in my community and around the world as just as possible.

In recent years I've had this growing mental "itch". This itch is the desire to help people and make things better for society. For a while it was frustrating because I knew vaguely there was a way to do that but I did not have a clear understanding of public policy. My best understanding for a while was that people wanted or needed things and sometimes government did those things. I didn't know the words "public policy" let alone the field. Thankfully I've since taken an introductory course in public policy and have had the haze in front of it cleared and a path for me visible.

In high school I knew I wanted to "fix" the environment. I saw the world in a clockwork manner and knew people were throwing off the mechanism. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to work on that right away. I ended up finding myself attending Santa Monica College a little bit unsure of what my path was. I struggled a bit as an environmental science major but luckily found the Center for Environmental and Urban Studies and Eco-Action Club. At the CEUS I was able to meet people with passion for the environment. This is where the seeds of public policy and public service really took root in my mind. At the time a policy was being looked at by the LA Metro to begin a pilot study of a universal student bus pass program for the region. The CEUS' director Ferris Kawar wanted somebody from SMC to make a comment at the board meeting so I volunteered myself. That board meeting was the first public meeting I had ever been to and it showed me a whole world I was unfamiliar with. For me policy, laws, and "government stuff" were things I read about in my textbook in high school and not things I could have a say or effect on. Nevertheless there I was inserting myself into the public policy process although not aware of it at the time. Since that point nearly three years ago I've done my best to be of service to the CEUS with things small and large such as speaking to students about sustainability during campus events or assisting with longer term projects such as the current beginning effort to rework waste on campus.

I've continued to want to "fix" the environment as I did in high school but have now found myself particularly interested in transportation and public transit. I don't drive and have a long commute to Santa Monica from my home in Pico Rivera. Riding the trains and busses to school has given me a unique perspective on transportation. Recently during these long commutes I've begun to ask, "What should we expect or demand of our transportation system?" "How far should someone be able to travel and how long should it take?" I believe the answers are we should demand more and people should be able to travel further faster. However, these thoughts were just thoughts in my head for a while until I finally took a public policy course.

I had the pleasure of taking Introduction to Public Policy with Bill Gelfeld, an assistant policy researcher at RAND Corporation. In his course I was finally introduced to public policy as a concept and field. He even arranged a visit to RAND offices in Santa Monica. Suddenly things began to fall into place in my mind. Public policy is the tool that is used to solve public scale problems. This is what I want to do. The work behind public policy is extensive requiring qualitative and quantitative research. Questions can be difficult to understand and the answers numerous and deserving of varying consideration. That challenge makes public policy all the more intriguing and, surprisingly, fun. Intro to Public Policy has easily been one of my favorite courses.

Today having an understanding of public policy has completely changed the way I think, for the better. I find myself being more analytical, critical, and just plain informed about issues.

I've begun to nag my local transit service about a trip planning service they teased well over 1000 days ago. I attend local city council meetings. I know that I need to do something. What I see for myself is a degree in environmental policy, or possibly public service (which I just learned about), from UC Davis. I would love to be able to squeeze in a year of public service in the field. Occasionally my mind runs to simply dropping everything and joining the California Conservation Corps. Following that I hope to involve myself with an institution of stature such as RAND (or even SCAG!) I believe this current opportunity with SCAG is the perfect first step. In the meanwhile I do what I can with the skills I have now. Thank you for your consideration.

Throughout high school, I was a member of student organizations in many different fields, including politics, science, and music. The more I worked with political clubs, the more their complexity fascinated me. During my junior year, I began to notice that many high school students wanted to get involved in the political process before they could vote, but didn't know how.

As I reached out to adults advocating for different policies and working in various government sectors, new students walked in the door. I was most excited to see my peers advertising meetings to their friends, since they considered the program meaningful enough to share with others.

I sought to capitalize on this momentum by creating CivicSpeakers.org to reach out to like-minded students at other schools. The support that I received over the website and Civic Speakers social media pages showed me the infectious nature of the cause. As Civic Speakers clubs pop up in high schools across Los Angeles, I am proud that my efforts are helping others improve their own communities. I hope that through the speaker series, students will gain a vital and useful civic education, with which they will be empowered to influence their

Planning a Future

Public transportation has been a vital part of my life. This year, I was able to perform an in-depth study about it. My high school requires graduating seniors to produce a senior project that either helps the community or expands the student's personal identity. My project focused on the decrease of ridership for Metro Los Angeles, the main public transportation agency in Los Angeles County. The purpose of this project was to find out what is causing bus ridership in the region to drop. I found out that it is decreasing due to inconvenient headways, the rise in people driving and a decrease in the price of gasoline, a new law allowing undocumented immigrants to obtain a driver's license, and much more reasons. Prior to this, I assumed that transit planning was just proposing different bus and train routes and which corridor it should operate on.

Through this project, I found out that it consists of many complicated layers. Questions like "who is going to ride the route" or "what should the frequency of the route be" or "who is going to fund the new lines" all play a fundamental role in determining the creation of a new route. I want to bring my passion for transportation and the knowledge that I gained to SCAG.

With more than 100 miles of rail and 172 bus routes, Metro Los Angeles is expanding its public transportation system, and my goal is to become an active part of that process. I am applying to this scholarship program because I am passionate about public transportation and I want to contribute directly to the public transit system in Los Angeles County as an urban planner. Eighteen years ago, in the city of San Gabriel, California, I came into this world with the help of public transportation. Metro Los Angeles Line 78 brought my parents to the hospital the day I was born. My deep passion for public transportation traces back all the way to this time.

My first major public transportation ride took place in June of 2000. I was only three months old, and the Metro Los Angeles Red Line extension from Hollywood to North Hollywood was celebrating its opening. My family relies on public transportation for all of our traveling needs, whether it be a trip to work, school, a grocery store, or a new adventure. I love using mass transit to travel as a car-free individual since I do not have to worry about traffic congestion or parking. I can simply sit back, relax, and leave the driving to the transit operator.

When I was six years old, my interest in public transit turned into a passion for transportation planning. That's when I started to collect paper bus schedules and public transportation system maps. I would look at the maps in awe and think about the vastness of Los Angeles County's public transit system. My fascination with mass transit grew as I began to memorize all of the bus routes and rail lines in the Metro Los Angeles system. My older sister and I would play a game in which she would give me a random number and I could easily tell her where the route starts, ends, and which corridor it serves. She would also ask me questions concerning trip planning and I loved being able to give her the public transit directions without having to look at a map or route schedule. Additionally, I would create my own routes by drawing them onto the system maps.

As I grew older, I began using Google's My Maps to create new bus and train route proposals. I even reached out to public transportation agencies in Los Angeles County and sent them these proposals. I would love to have the opportunity to apply my passion to a summer program at an urban planning office. My hometown, Glendale, is currently neither served by a light rail nor a bus rapid transit line. I envision a future in which public transit reaches every corner of Los Angeles County. I am an active follower of transportation news and am excited that Metro Los Angeles is planning to build a bus rapid transit route between North Hollywood and Pasadena. This line would travel across Burbank, Glendale, and Eagle Rock, connecting East San Fernando Valley to West San Gabriel Valley.

Two years ago, I had the honor of being interviewed about my passion for public transit by KPCC and NBC Asian America. In these interviews, I was able to share my ideas and hopes for the future of public transit in Los Angeles. I have also been very involved with public transportation's online community. From August to November of 2016, I advocated for Measure M, a sales tax ballot set to reduce traffic congestion, improve mobility, and expand the public transportation system in Los Angeles County. I was heavily engaged in sharing information about this ballot on social media and attended events that promoted it. With the passage of Measure M, the transportation revolution is gaining momentum. Who knows? In several decades, Los Angeles County might be home to the largest public transportation systems in the nation, perhaps second to only New York City.

Furthermore, I want to invest my time and work in the concept of urban mobility. I believe that it is really important for people to commute and get around the city easily and freely, especially for those who do not own a car. With increased urban mobility they'll be able to use various modes of transport to commute, such as the bus, train, light rail, subway, bicycle, or even walking. Recently, because of my enthusiasm for the open streets event, San Gabriel Valley's 626 Golden Streets gave me a VIP guest pass for the day. The event was focused on active transportation and I was grateful to be able to participate in the celebration of local culture.

My goal for the future is to major in transportation planning at a four-year university in the region. I hope to become a transportation planner on a team that will help to expand and improve our current public transportation system in Los Angeles County. Specifically, I would love to hold a job with Metro Los Angeles. As part of the Millennial Generation, I am proud to be one of the youths out there who care about public transportation, sustainable mobility, and improving the safety of streets. An eminent urbanist and activist named Jane Jacobs once said that "cities have the capability of providing something for everybody, only because, and only when, they are created by everybody." Through all of everyone's ideas and proposals, a successful and sustainable city will be created for the people, by the people, and I want to play a direct role in making that happen.

I used to resent my name. On the first day of school every year, at least two teachers would inevitably call out, "?", before my suspicion about being summoned was affirmed.

At a glance, the "" in my name morphed into "." But that was hardly the cause for grievance. The most dreadful part proceeded right after, when they would realize their mistake and feel the need to satiate their curiosity or guilt. The most dreadful part was the godforsaken question: "How do you pronounce that?"

I could provide the most accurate pinyin pronunciation of my name — which would be discarded in futility — or offer the anglicized version—which would be accepted with minimal commotion. Inadvertently, I always found myself choosing the latter.

My internal conflict balancing a Chinese cultural background in a fundamentally Western society has been the root of my struggle with identity. At crossroads, it was much easier to conform to expectations — as much as I detested my reasons.

One particular moment, right after my family moved into a new house in California, is a painful reminder.

I remember the contractor furrowing his brows in confusion. He rephrased his question slowly, more simplistically. I understood, but I stayed silent.

My mother struggled with fragments of barely discernible English. "Sorry? No, you understand. Cannot this, like do."

As I watched her battle with words foreign to her tongue, I felt a burning sense of shame. Shame, not at my refusal to help her, but rather at her inability to speak English coherently.

I was ashamed of my Chinese mother, the Chinese heritage she represented — because I was fearful of the degrading, confining framework I would be perceived through and judged upon. In America, when people have asked me where I'm "from," they haven't asked to learn. Chinese is what they want to hear.

My fears were substantiated the hard way, when I got my first taste of politics volunteering on a local campaign.

One Saturday evening, I checked my clipboard and knocked. It was a routine — one after another. After a moment of silence, the door creaked open, and I greeted an unfamiliar face with a smile.

"Hi, Martin, I'm a volunteer with the Sukhee Kang for State Senate campaign. Do you have a minute?"

For a few seconds, he just stared. Then he moved to shut the door.

"Go back to China."

My mind reeled from those four words. Then waves of humiliation crashed over me, a stark reminder of the stereotypes that I had tried so hard to run from. I have to go home, I thought.

But then I felt outrage, bubbling beneath my skin. Why did I have any less of a place in this country than he?

As I've become more immersed in politics, I've realized that misconceptions and misconstrued notions are pervasive because people like to categorize others in one way or another, both for their convenience and confirmation.

But politics also gives people autonomy — the ability to share and elevate stories often unheard, unconventional, beyond perfectly drawn lines. Politics gives people a platform to speak, and a medium through which to be heard.

I could have wallowed in misery, but I chose to continue canvassing. That day, I engaged thirty other strangers I never thought I'd have the courage to talk to.

What ultimately moves policy forward is human stories — and through campaigning, I've realized that connecting with people face-to-face is how perceptions are changed.

But more so than that—as I knocked on door after door, until my voice was hoarse and my feet blistered—I realized I was canvassing for more than a single state senate election. Healthcare, employment, food security, education. Every person had a story, and hearing their passions lit a flame in me. It is the stories, simple, forgotten but emotionally stirring, that need a platform. It is Linda who cannot break into the job market, Darren who cannot reunite with his family, and Xochitl who cannot afford higher education.

Politics reminds me of identities are multi-layered complexities, how invaluable it is to share the human experience, and how struggles go unheard without compassion.

In my mind, I have a clear vision of where I see myself in the future, and of how I want to serve society. I strive to be a public servant, to lift the passions and problems of constituents from behind closed doors to legislative forums. I hope to gain an in-depth understanding of policymaking institutions, their functions and flaws, and ultimately advance policies and laws more just for all.

In the meantime, activism is my avenue of channeling frustration into action, fear into empowerment. Speaking out has shown me my identity is mine to claim. I'm neither exclusively Chinese nor exclusively American, and I'm not the mainstream narrative of either. My identity is shaped by irreproducible experiences and inseparable culture — part of which is Chinese.

You don't have to answer that, Mrs. Lindfors. That was a rhetorical question." Of course I was quite impressed by how closely was following current events and by apt use of a rhetorical term! Everyone who knows understands how passionate is about the environment. I know will bring considerable knowledge and deep interest to college major—environmental studies. is the real deal.

My students have an opportunity to deliver a highly crafted persuasive speech each fall, and I always select one or two exemplary speeches from the previous year to photocopy for my current students as mentor texts. Just last week my current students read and studied—you guessed it— excellent speech on why we should all adopt a vegan diet (for our health as well as the planet's). speech, like all of writing, was simply superb on all counts.

reads complex and nuanced texts with searing analysis, writes with flair and joy, debates with preparation and classic argumentation skills (was one of my best debate captains last year), and does all of this with a smile and great personal magnetism.

is a gem. I give my highest recommendation for your scholarship.

Two case studies: 1) The Youth Entrepreneurs (TYE) 2) Assistant/Volunteer Coaching

CASE 1: TYE Business Plan Competition has a pretty straight-forward mission statement: foster innovative thinking in students by connecting successful entrepreneurs and business leaders with young people. The dilemma we faced was equally straightforward: find a niche in the intellectual property "quilt" that didn't infringe upon someone else's patent/copyright/trademark. I have to admit, it was nearly impossible given the inordinate number of brilliant minds who had already seized upon the great issues of our time. Education. Conservation. Clean water accessibility. Gender equality. Countless inventions. And the list goes on.

Then it almost hit me. One day, as I was walking home from school, two people were racing down the street in my neighborhood: from what I could make out, a senior citizen in a Jeep Wrangler and a teenager in a souped-up Honda Civic. The cars narrowly missed me - it was all a BLUR.

(PAUSE) Cars. Young people. Senior citizens. BLUR!

"Guys, why don't we create an app that is in the spirit of the competition - connecting people! We should find a way to unite young people who want to make a difference and older people who also want to make a difference. Everyone is always saying or complaining that there is a stark contrast between generations. Let's BLUR these lines," I said to my TYE team-members.

And there you have it - BLUR was born. Our business model was to develop an app, like Uber, which would help that older gentleman in the Jeep Wrangler and that teenager in the souped-up Honda Civic develop a bond - not based on vehicular valiance; rather, create a space (both real and digital) so that they could freely exchange their generations' conceptions on a whole host of issues - maybe beginning with responsible driving.

CASE 2: I was born via: water birth. I think this fact is prophetically poetic to how important, even from the beginning, the pool and my swimming community have been to my physical, psychological, and ethical development.

Three Phases.

Pre-pubescent - Obviously, I'm not the only kid out there who joined a swim team, but my relationship with my favorite coach, Coach Brent, has had a significant impact on my pre-pubescent years. "Good sportsmanship "Keep a positive attitude." "Don't stress about medals, stress about effort." Ultimately, his ubiquitous swimming philosophy helped a young kid overcome what seemed to be insurmountable mountains

Puberty - Obviously, we've all endured this quixotic time period in our lives. I would use an expletive, but I know that this is not the appropriate setting. If I didn't have Irvine Novaquatics and the Irvine Swim League, I would not have been able to endure the weird, psychological, and physiological turmoil that was brewing inside of me. Discipline. Concentration. Self-sacrifice. Distraction. All of these words encompassed how my swimming community helped me avoid the traps that other teens fall into.

High School/Giving Back - A not so obvious senior year. An unexpected sense of seriousness and responsibility assuaged much of my teenage angst. I won't sit here and bore you with all the lifeguarding, First Aid, CPR/AED certifications I've achieved, but what I will convey is how proud I am of becoming, for the past three years, an Assistant/Volunteer Coach. Watching a whole new generation of swimmers grow up before me, I have a more grounded understanding of my own journey (I hate to admit this, but I also have come to appreciate my parents' perspective when they had to endure my juvenile insolence).

Just last week, I had an almost deja vu-like encounter with my little swimmer Melissa.

Obviously, my analogies need a little work.

My story doesn't end here: I will be attending UT Austin in the fall and I plan to get Certificates in Business & Public Policy as well as Undergraduate Real Estate. All I need now is another internship in order to buttress my enthusiasm with tangible skill sets. I want to continue creating value for my shareholders/bosses, but more importantly, for my community at large.

SCAG Scholarship Program Personal Statement

In middle school I was introduced to engineering through my sister who was in Project
Lead the Way (PLTW), the engineering program at my future high school. My sister would take
home projects from her engineering class to work on and tell me how she would get the needed
result. I was fascinated with the skills she acquired from class. The following school year I was
placed in Introduction to Engineering Design where I was able to learn the fundamentals of
following the design process and gained more experience in working with others for projects.

This class motivated me to stay in PLTW as I saw potential in growing my interests in
engineering. For each class I was able to take, my passion for engineering grew stronger. Being
in PLTW made me think critically and find solutions in different ways using my gained technical
skills. I discovered the wide range of engineering and found that much of my life was impacted
by the work of engineers.

In my junior year, I took AP Environmental Science (APES). Like my engineering classes, this course made me view the world through a different lens. I took a large interest in many of the concepts my APES teacher taught us, including the controversies between industries and government environmental policies. As I became more interested in the field of environmental science, I was stuck considering pursuing civil engineering or a career in environmental studies. In APES, I enjoyed the hands-on learning with many labs teaching physical occurrences in the world, such as soil properties in different ecosystems. By taking APES I was influenced to preserve the welfare of the planet-but I also sought to have a positive impact on the lives of citizens through my potential work on infrastructure. I began to look at

University of California Riverside's Bourns College of Engineering, and as I read about the Department of Chemical and Environmental Engineering, I decided this was the path I wanted to take after high school. Even though I am young, I will not be silenced. I am a champion for progressive causes and I proudly let everyone know it.

To gain experience that I could use in my future endeavors in politics, I started attending the Southwest Riverside County Democratic Club's monthly meetings. At my first meeting, I showed up bright-eyed, wearing a Bernie Sanders T-Shirt, and gave a speech discussing my dreams of becoming a Democratic Party leader. I expressed excitement about being a newly registered voter and a political activist. My speech was noticed by several politicians attending the club meeting including Julia Peacock who is running to oust Ken Calvert in CA's 42nd Congressional District, Michelle Singleton who hopes to defeat Melissa Melendez in November for California's 67th State Assembly District, and Kelly Faul, an independent progressive also running for CA's 67th State Assembly District. The three campaigns, as well as the club itself. asked me to volunteer for them in such positions as a campaigner, communications director, and headquarters intern. I accepted a position with the Kelly Faul campaign as I felt the most passionate about her progressive policy plans including expanding the number of medical school scholarship programs in Riverside County to help fix the 3,000:1 doctor-to-patient ratio in our local community. With Kelly's campaign, I phone-bank, study voter issues, and go door-to-door discussing Ms. Faul's qualifications and campaign goals, most of which she is already trying to accomplish as an ordinary citizen who is not even in elected office yet. I admire so greatly how much Kelly wants to help people. She doesn't just promise to do things for people once she is in office; she promises to help them now.

As well as experience working for Kelly, I recently traveled to Washington D.C. to gain political insight and see the place I hope to one day live and work. I, along with my sister Tiffany and her boyfriend Nathan toured the East Wing of the White House and received a special Capitol tour from an intern for Senator Chuck Schumer (D-NY). We also visited the Lincoln Memorial and the Washington Monument.

I plan on attending UC Santa Barbara this fall and majoring in political science. Upon graduation, I dream of going to Harvard Law School. I want to start my career as a public defender so I can directly help many people. I know that many people in this country, particularly members of racial minority groups, are wrongly accused of crimes. These crimes often carry lengthy mandatory-minimum prison sentences. I want to be able to help people who cannot afford a private attorney; I want to save people who are scared their lives are over. I want to be a champion for all. My dream is to branch out from law into politics after establishing myself as a credible lawyer. Kamala Harris, a true inspiration of mine, followed this similar path. One day, I will take the experiences I have in politics as a campaign organizer and will have in law as a public defender and will use them to build a political career of my own. My dream is to one day be a United States Senator, and then the President of the United States. As Senator, I will introduce legislation that will bring forth healthcare coverage to all Americans, expand education funding from K-12 to Preschool through graduate school, and increase public funding for urban development projects such as public parks, recreational facilities, and clean and reusable energy sources. I will also recommend that America legalizes marijuana use and taxes marijuana sales nationwide which would substantially lower the costs of prison upkeep due to thousands of less arrests per year on drug charges, as well as raise billions of dollars of tax revenue that can be used to cover such plans I listed previously.

Ever since I took my first history class in high school I fell in love with government and policy and found a passion for piecing together the logistics of law, economics, and the business that makes a democracy function smoothly. In addition, teachers strengthened my fascination for public policy, however, they showed me the insurmountable challenges communities like mine faced. This increased my determination to make a difference in my hometown and the nation.

To get a better understanding of local politics and find a future career that would best suit me, I began attending city council meetings and school board meetings. Instantly, I noticed there weren't many Hispanic attendees, nor were there any Hispanic board members. Coming from a Hispanic and low-income area, I can see the struggle my peers and community face as a result of underrepresentation on a local and national scale. This realization enforced my desire be a voice in politics for those who do not understand the importance of voting and the profound setbacks we as minorities have for not having a say as to what happens in the city we live in. By encouraging people of Hispanic descent to vote, they can vote people out who are not inclusive of minorities and vote people in who have a plan for the betterment of the city.

At that point, I knew I wanted to become a lawyer and use that as a stepping stone to one day become a politician, so I attended the Intensive Law and Trial program at Stanford University which was the most significant educational opportunity I could have experienced. This 10-day program allowed me to immerse myself in the theory and practice of law and develop a roadmap to become a lawyer. I was exposed to legal rhetoric and ethics from legal professionals, including lectures from Stanford Law professors. During these lectures I learned how to prepare for a court case and gained analytical skills from studying cases ahead of time, like an attorney. I also practiced the art of creating an effective opening and closing statement and directly examined witnesses. After many days of preparing for a court case, I was finally able to present it in the San Francisco Superior Court. This was especially nerve-racking because this was my first time participating in a mock trial case. However, once it was my turn to speak and advocate for my client, I gained a new sense of confidence that allowed me to compose effective arguments and respond to questions or disputes. Through this program I learned to be more open minded, embrace change, and gained invaluable hands-on experience that have reinforced my commitment to one day become a lawyer.

I hope to one day defend those in my community as a lawyer and offer legal advice to those who cannot afford it. I believe that it is important that I come back to my community once I graduate from the University of California, Davis, after having received a bachelor's degree in political science and attending law school, so that I can help community members have their voices heard once and for all. Before I reach a national scale and become a politician to make policies that will change people's lives for the better, I know that the change that I want to initiate must happen at home first.



Brief Description of Your Work Responsibilities:

I teach and revise curriculum and coordinate schedules with students and parents. I also build a client base with references and recommendations.

If I am being completely honest, I knew very little about public service until I was appointed to be on the Moorpark Teen Council in 9th grade. I had applied to it as something that would look good on my resume and make me look appealing to colleges. At that point in my life, true to stereotypical, Indian family expectations, I was going to major in biology with the intention of going to medical school. My father works in IT, and my mother never got to continue higher education after marriage, so they had high hopes of having a doctor in the family. But while I wanted to appease them greatly, my heart was never truly in the STEM field. I never got fired up or passionate about it the way I did when I explained the Electoral College to my parents, or when I heatedly discussed the 2016 Presidential Election with my cousins in India. Gradually but assuredly, I realized what I was truly interested in. But before that, let's get back to where it all started.

On the Teen Council, I worked with parks and recreation to help plan, organize, and execute various citywide events in Moorpark. I remember when I was younger, I could wake up, get dressed, and go enjoy the events that the city would put on, being thrilled at the parades, frightened in the haunted houses, and giddy at the Easter Egg Hunt. But I never thought about how all these events were organized. It was not until I was on the teen council that I physically saw all the thought, care, and hard work that was poured into every single event, holiday, and activity. I noticed the recreation center supervisors making calls to buy food, decorations, entertainment, and every necessity imaginable. To put so much effort and so many hours in, working countless days and nights leading up to the event for a couple hours of fun seemed unfathomable to me. My fellow council members and I moaned and groaned about getting up at 6:00 in the morning, only to wait around for the kids and parents to show up. However, when the first families arrived, the children running in, beaming and glowing at the excitement, I could not help but join in the glee.

They were awestruck to see Santa, tugging on their parents' sleeves to hurry up because they wanted to tell him what they wanted for Christmas. Or they were dressed up as princesses and ninjas on Halloween, yelling "Boo!" as they walked in, giving us a reason to over exaggeratedly cry in fear. With each passing year, I slowly began to realize that the work we did had a bigger purpose. It was so much more important than the few hours that the fun lasted. It

was the eager anticipation of the kids and parents for their favorite holidays. It was the pride that we took in our city. It was the moment of arrival, seeing the hundred of neighbors, all from the same town, gathered to celebrate. Our work created a community. Moorpark wasn't just a city. It was a home. If I seem too cheesy, it might be because I am. But nothing has ever filled me with so much warmth and pride, and I will always want to recreate it. That was the first time I understood just how special public service was.

After that, I became much more engaged in my school's student leadership. I enjoyed the connections I made, and I enjoyed working with and helping people. It felt personal and meaningful, and I was honored to be someone who my peers looked up to. The positions that have meant the most to me have been that of Color Guard Captain and President of the Instrumental Music Program. When the students in the program have needed someone to talk to, I have been that person. They see me as a leader that they know and trust, and because they trust me, they feel safe enough to confide in me. Sometimes the problems are as trivial as math lessons that are frustrating, or issues with time management, where they just need a little encouragement and support from a well-meaning upperclassman. And sometimes, the problems are drastic, having to do with depression and self-harm, an instance in which they need the courage to ask for help from their parents or a professional. Regardless of the matter, members of the music program feel that they can come to me, and I am always thankful to have their trust because it allows me to help them. Seeing them get better and grow is what inspires me as a leader.

Lastly, one of the most influential factors in my motivation was my selection to participate in the Asian Pacific Youth Leadership Project. This is a fully funded conference that 50 Asian and Pacific Islander students are selected to attend every year, where we learn about public service and careers in government. We conducted mock senate sessions, sat in mock committee hearings, advocated for our bills to pass into law, and lobbied our bills to actual senate member staffers. It was an incredibly educational experience that gave me a concrete idea of what it meant to work in government. It made me eager to tackle legislative work, hefty bills and all. But more importantly, the conference had numerous workshops on culture and identity. It is increasingly important for Asian Americans to have representation in government, and the

conference advisors helped us find the skills we needed moving forward to contribute to this cause. They emphasized again and again the importance of appreciating diversity and carrying our unique identity with us. Your identity is what makes you different as a leader and in turn makes what you bring to the table special. I've carried that lesson with me in everything that I've done since, and it makes be proud to be an Indian American.

I moved to the United States as a toddler, and, despite the culture shock and strangeness of a new place, California quickly became my home. My passion for helping others, enthusiasm for government, and pride in my cultural identity have all solidified my decision to pursue a career in public service. Being a public servant means that I am able to represent the people that I care so much about. It means I get to work for the betterment of my home. It took a long time for me to understand this career, but since I decided to follow it, I have never doubted my resolve.

Activities A:

- CAUSE stands for Central Coast Alliance United for a Sustainable Economy. I was a
 facilitator, where I would control some of the meetings and events we have. For CAUSE
 we work with leaders in government to work towards environmentally friendly policies,
 advocacy for migrant communities, advancement of youth opportunities, and the pursuit
 of equality.
- Robotics is a team that is in Santa Paula High School. We have four teams which are Mechanical, Business, Electrical and Programming. I held the position of Assistant Mechanical Manager in which I would I help the manager of the Mechanical Team. And take over as manager when the original manager is absent. Every week from January to March, I would stay for 3 hours every day afterschool to work in the robotics team, where I work on the mechanical aspects of the robot, like the wheels and chassis of the robot.
- Geo-Bowl is a high school trivia competition of geography. In which teams must get an
 answer for a question relating to geography right. In the position of Captain, I have to
 organize when we meet, and develop strategy for our competition
- Knowledge Bowl is a high school trivia competition about every subject. In this competition you are in teams of four in which one person must answer the question the fastest. Teams win by competing with other schools in various rounds and winning multiple rounds. My position of Co-Captain is to take the lead of our matches when the Main Captain is gone.
- In Book Club, we all gather books and read them for about a month and return to discuss about them

Activities B:

- AVID Club stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination club. I founded the club because AVID is actually a class which requires community service. Since there was an absence of community service opportunities in the community, I founded AVID Club to fulfill that need. I work with my local library to set up tutoring for elementary school kids to help them with their homework, since many of their parents don't speak English or understand it. I also created various community service events like food drives, money donation drives, clean-up events and other forms of helping our community.
- Key Club is a community service driven club, and is part of Kiwanis International. In this
 club we participate in many community service events.

When I was child, in my summer and winter breaks I would always travel. Whether it was from going with my father at his job as a truck driver or traveling to see family across the country, I always would be amazed at the infrastructure used in the American highway system and the layout of urban and rural cities. From the way highways and roads were carved into the landscape to protect the environment. To the complex marvels of engineering which provide a safe and speedy passageway for drivers in the most congested cities. Examples like this are seen in areas like the High Five Interchange in Dallas, Texas which allows for high volumes traffic to flow smoothly in Dallas using a five level highway interchange, or the Interstate 15 Virgin River Corridor in Arizona in which human engineering create a safe scenic drive through one of nature's works of wonder while protecting the land around the highway.

What I also noticed on my trips were the differences between my community compared to other more affluent communities. For example how come in low-income migrant communities like mine, are not receiving the benefits of high income communities. And why does my community have to face the problems created by the growing population in Southern California. Problems like the lack of resources created from the increase in population. My town of Santa Paula is based on an agrarian economy, where mostly everyone works in the fields or other forms of agriculture and don't earn a lot of money. However Santa Paula is a beautiful community and many like me have tried to keep it that way and even improve it as well. I partake in a

community advocacy group called Central Alliance United for a Sustainable Economy, or CAUSE for short.

In CAUSE I helped to stop the creation of a fossil fuel power plant which would have polluted the air my community. The placement of this fossil fuel power plant was proposed by a company called Calpine Corp trying to earn a power supply contract from the electricity company Socal Edison. This power plant would only benefit the more affluent communities like Malibu and Santa Barbara. While then it would give my community to suffer all the consequences from it. In CAUSE, we made sure community members came out to show their stance against this proposed fossil fuel power plant. We then worked with local community leaders, like the City Council of Santa Paula, to look for more cleaner and renewable ways of energy. This forced SoCal Edison to change their application to only accept their power supply from clean sources of energy.

With CAUSE was also a push for more opportunities for youth in Santa Paula. In working with the City Council we were able to create a Youth Council to allow for youth to have a say in city council meetings. We were also able to allocate funds for youth programs in the community. In working with the city council, we were able to speak one on one with city leaders and have a say in policymaking. Which really interested me into government and policy making.

Although I have done a lot of work with local government. I really like math and to use it in designing new approaches to the problems of life. What I aspire to do in the future is to be able to study for engineering and implement these skills in whichever way possible. If I were to work in public service, I would use my skills from engineering to improve the condition of

transportation and infrastructure in the community. Like be able to create projects that can decrease traffic congestion, create homes and buildings which would improve living conditions, and be able to work with others to solve the issues our communities face.
