### **CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Chair Marquez called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. and asked Regional Councilmember Jan Harnik, Riverside County Representative, to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. 2024 SCAG Scholarship Program

There were no public comments for Item 2.



Chair Marquez thanked the members for taking the time to participate in this committee. He expressed that one of their distinct privileges as elected officials was to inspire and support the next generation of public servants. He provided brief information on the scholarship program and noted they would try their best to deliberate and go through the process in a fair manner. He also thanked their partners at the California Transportation Foundation (CTF) for including two additional scholarships for a total of 11.

Rachel Wagner, Government Affairs Officer, provided a brief report on the number of applications that were received per county, how many scholarships there were, information on the process for screening the scholarship applications, and next steps for approval of the Scholarship Committee's recommendation by the Regional Council.

The Scholarship Committee engaged in discussions about the applicants from each county and deliberated which applicants should move forward in the process. The Scholarship Committee also deferred to the academia representative, Dr. James Moore, CTF representative, to determine which students would receive the CTF-funded 2024 SCAG Scholarship Program Awards. The Committee also suggested doing an additional scholarship for a total of 12 scholarships.

Javiera Cartagena, Chief Government and Public Affairs Officer, provided context on the number of scholarships they could give based off what was in the budget.

Regional Council Member Valerie Amezcua asked if there was funding for the additional scholarship.

Ms. Cartagena explained that they did not have the funds and would have to look into it and provide a report to the Regional Council to see if they can do this.

Regional Council Member Jan Harnik expressed concern with adding an additional scholarship since they had passed a budget. She suggested adding to the motion to make it clear that if for some reason someone was not able to use the scholarship, whatever the reason might be, then the alternate would get it.

Regional Council Member David Shapiro indicated that he was fine with original motion but would defer to the rest.

Regional Council Member Harnik suggested adding to the motion that if there were private donors then they would provide the scholarship but if there was not, then they would stay within the agreed guidelines.



Regional Council Member Kathleen Kelly indicated that it was Regional Council Member Shapiro and her intent that if there were funds available for the twelfth scholarship then the committee would identify 251 as the recipient.

A MOTION was made (Shapiro) to recommend approval of the following slate of applications: *Imperial County*: 107; *Los Angeles County*: 208 and 220; *Orange County*: 306; *Riverside County*: 410; *San Bernardino County*: 504; *Ventura County*: 604, CTF: 508 and 230; Wild Card: 124 and 307; and 251 if funds are available. Motion was SECONDED (Kelly). The motion passed by the following roll call votes:

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

Recommend one (1) student each from Imperial, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Ventura counties and recommend two (2) students from Los Angeles County to receive the 2025 SCAG Scholarship Program Award. The Scholarship Committee may, at its discretion (not compulsory), recommend two (2) additional scholarship awards from any of the six counties. In addition to the SCAG-funded scholarships, the Committee should recommend one (1) additional scholarship to be funded by the California Transportation Foundation (CTF).

#### **STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:**

This item supports the following Strategic Priority 4: Build a unified culture anchored in the pursuit of organizational excellence.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The SCAG Scholarship Committee was formed by the Regional Council and SCAG President to evaluate submitted applications for the SCAG Scholarship Program, the purpose of which is to provide financial support to a select group of high school and community college students, particularly those interested in pursuing planning and/or public service-related careers. This year, SCAG received 165 applications in total, with 99 applications meeting the minimum requirements. Of those, staff has forwarded 42 to the Scholarship Committee for the committee's evaluation.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

#### SCAG Scholarship Program:

In July 2009, the Regional Council (RC) approved the SCAG Scholarship Pilot Program, which is intended to provide financial support to a select group of high school and community college students to develop their long-term career goals. Now in its fourteenth year, the program is open to high school seniors and community college students who reside in the six-county SCAG region.



Students applying are required to have a minimum 3.0 grade point average and must be enrolled in higher education if graduating. As part of the application, students are required to submit a completed application form, a minimum 500-word essay describing their interests in community planning, regional planning, urban planning, civil engineering, political science, public administration, sustainable development, or other related fields, two letters of recommendation, and a current transcript of records.

## Overview of the Applications:

Applications for the SCAG Scholarship Program opened on February 7, 2025 and were due electronically by March 21, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. SCAG received a total of 165 applications, of which 99 met the application requirements. There were 28 from Imperial County, 37 from Los Angeles County, five from Orange County, 17 from Riverside County, five from San Bernardino County, and seven from Ventura County. Applications were screened based on the minimum requirements and the interests described in the essay portion. Although many of the applicants met the minimum requirements, primarily those students who exhibited some interest in the disciplines listed above were forwarded to the Scholarship Committee. Applicants who did not submit the required application materials were sent a courtesy e-mail to submit the missing item(s) by the deadline.

Staff has forwarded 42 applications, consisting of 12 from Imperial County, 13 from Los Angeles County, four from Orange County, six from Riverside County, three from San Bernardino County, and four from Ventura County to the Scholarship Committee for further evaluation.

Apart from the SCAG-funded awards, the California Transportation Foundation (CTF) will provide funding for one additional scholarship award. The California Transportation Foundation was founded in 1988 to support the Caltrans community and was later expanded to serve private and public sector transportation employees through various charitable activities.

Names and other personal identifiers have been removed from the applications, essays, letters of recommendation, transcripts, and other supporting documents to protect the privacy of the students. Each forwarded application has been assigned a number for reference.

In addition to redacted applications, attachments below include a ranking sheet to assist Committee Members as they review applications. In prior years, selection of scholarship finalists has been achieved via Committee consensus.

#### Recommended Action:

Staff recommends that the Scholarship Committee evaluate the applications and select one student each from Imperial, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, and Ventura counties and two students from Los Angeles County to receive the 2025 SCAG Scholarship Program Award. The Scholarship Committee may, at its discretion, recommend two additional students from any of the six counties.



In addition to the SCAG funded scholarships, the Committee may recommend one additional scholarship to be funded by CTF.

The Scholarship Committee's selections will be forwarded to the RC for final approval at the RC's meeting on May 1, 2025.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The SCAG Scholarship Program cost would be a minimum of \$28,000 for seven (7) scholarship awards, or a maximum of \$36,000 if two (2) additional scholarships are awarded. Funds are included in the FY 2025-26 General Fund Budget.



As I stepped on stage, salutatorian award in hand from my middle school, I'd soon find out that one of my closest friends—Alex—would be going to juvie for possession of controlled substances. That was no isolated incident; as I grew and entered high school, I'd find several other acquaintances in similar troubles. While I could see them for more than their mishaps and mistakes, it seemed like the rest of our world, in the small town that is the Imperial Valley, could not. Teachers, parents, students, and other friends could no longer see the compassion, intelligence, and diligence in their character that they once did. Instead, all they saw were my friends and acquaintances as people who had done drugs, people who, in their eyes, were no longer worthy of the same things and respect other kids were. From those experiences, my desire to pursue a career and education in public policy and political science grew immensely.

I was in a unique position; I was able to understand what led them to do those things. Personal traumas, depression, negative personal relations, and poverty were some of the reasons why these kids chose to do what they did, all of which are external and societal factors. While their choice was entirely theirs, the place that they grew up in, the society that made drugs seem like the only escape they could take, was a reason why they chose to do that. And instead of addressing the causes, policy dictated that these children did not deserve grace and that they had to be punished. In my life, I aim to change that.

I plan to ensure that kids like those I know and once knew can grow and rehabilitate. An education in political science will allow me to understand the changes that could be made, the gaps in my perception, and the necessary work to make those desires a reality.

Even now, I work to alleviate some of the troubles society leaves our youth with. I work with my school to build skills for struggling students as a leader in the Peer to Peer Program. I volunteer with Key Club and, more significantly, the American Civil Liberties Union, where I have helped advocate for fairer policies and greater protections for vulnerable communities. Most notably, I contributed to the record-breaking voter turnout in the Imperial Valley for the 2024 election, ensuring that underrepresented voices—many of whom are from communities disproportionately affected by punitive policies—had the opportunity to be heard. Working alongside the ACLU, I saw firsthand how structural barriers limit participation, and I dedicated myself to dismantling them. The same passion that drives me to defend civil liberties also compels me to fight for criminal justice reform, to shift the system from one of punishment to one of rehabilitation.

Through my work, I realized that policy alone is not enough—people need direct legal representation to challenge the injustices they face. Whether it's a worker denied fair wages, a tenant facing unlawful eviction, or a community targeted by punishments, legal advocacy is often the most immediate and powerful tool for change. That is why I plan to become a lawyer specializing in civil or labor law, using the law to protect people from the injustices that have long gone unchallenged. I want to ensure that vulnerable individuals are not left to navigate a system that was never built for them alone.

However, advocacy cannot end in the courtroom. The laws and policies that enable these injustices must be rewritten, and I intend to play a role in doing so. I want to continue working

with organizations like the ACLU and legislators who are committed to reforming policies that disproportionately harm marginalized communities. Whether it be challenging unjust labor laws that exploit workers, advocating for sentencing reform that prioritizes rehabilitation over incarceration, or pushing for greater voting accessibility, I plan to be at the forefront of these efforts. Change does not happen overnight, but through persistent advocacy, strategic litigation, and public policy reform, I am determined to create a more just and equitable society.

Every at-risk teen I have encountered in my schooling has hopes and dreams like anyone else. I want to ensure that those kids—and others in the future—are more able to make their desires a reality. I plan to lead programs that help students rehabilitate from addiction or other troubles and reach their fullest potential. The same could be said for adults; they also need help and support instead of scorn and resentment. Through public policy, advocacy, and direct legal action, I hope to reform society—specifically jails—into a place where punishment is a thing of the past. Instead, rehabilitation and support are at the center and focus of society.







#### SCAG SCHOLARSHIP PERSONAL STATEMENT

Once I realized how much my family had struggled, and continued to struggle with legal assistance on how to secure their citizenship, I knew I wanted to dedicate my education to helping them and other families. They were lost in a legal system with no one to guide them, no idea where to start, and constantly in fear of reaching out for help due to their legal status. My passion for political science was only further solidified by participation in my high school's Mock Trial Team. Compiling evidence for each year's case, and researching precedents set by cases decided by SCOTUS, my hunger to unravel the complexity of the law grew and I quickly fell into a rabbit hole of information that I could not get enough of. My sleepless nights and countless hours after school preparing for my Mock Trial competition solidified my goal to be an attorney, to familiarize myself with our legal system, and to assist my family with the knowledge that they never had. Imperial County being comprised of mainly Hispanic migrant working-class families, the fear of reaching out for help remains ever present, especially with the looming threat the President-elect's administration poses to immigrant communities across the nation. Researching political science has not only kept me informed but allowed me to advocate for my family and my community and help inform others about their rights and what is needed to defend themselves in their workplace and against immigration agencies in a nation that becomes more hostile to Latinos and minorities as a whole. My latest views on political changes occurring in my community have only made political science a larger part of my life and academic goals. There has been an immense political shift within my Latino community, reaching unprecedented levels in the most recent presidential election. The President-elect garnered a record high of 42% of Latino voters. Historically, the majority of Latinos have overwhelmingly supported the Democratic Party, but this election signals a continued shift toward the Republican Party. As a first-generation Mexican who grew up in a border town, I have developed a unique perspective on the dramatic shift in Latino voting patterns. While most political analysts have found this shift puzzling - often reaching misguided conclusions - I believe this shift was (unfortunately) overdue. It is in our culture, as Latinos, that we take pride in our work ethic and predominantly makeup America's low and middle class. When our communities and families continue living paycheck to paycheck, the Republican Party's emphasis on rewarding hard work becomes an appealing option. Despite the Democratic Party being the favorable option for Latinos and minorities, Democrats have largely faltered in effectively conveying their message to working-class voters. With a seemingly bigger emphasis on affluent and college-educated audiences, many Latinos feel overlooked and forgotten, leaving them with the misguided idea that their only choice is to jump ship. If the Democratic Party seeks to regain the support of Latino Voters, it is vital to emphasize their needs. If the Latino community within my county, and across the nation, seeks to make an impactful change, then we must focus on advocating and

staying informed, rather than following misguided conclusions. While my goal to become a lawyer remains a priority, my current occupation as a journalist has opened my eyes to how far advocacy goes and how it can go hand in hand with practicing law. Hearing stories of people in my community struggling with the local government, their horrible experiences with local attorneys taking advantage of people's lack of knowledge of legal processes, and hardships that could have been avoided with proper guidance breaks my heart to know that my community goes through this but only motivates me more to amplify their voices, and soon to practice the law to help them. Being able to research political changes within communities in the U.S. would give me the experience needed to best reach my goals to best help my Latino community to better succeed.

The journey toward my academic and professional goals began long before I could even speak. Raised in Compton by my great-grandmother, Honey, who stepped in when my parents lost custody due to addiction, I learned resilience, self-reliance, and the value of education early. Honey's wisdom taught me to pursue opportunities unapologetically, even when they seemed out of reach. Today, I stand as a Posse Scholar bound for Northwestern University, with plans to double major in Black Studies and Political Science, minor in Economics, and ultimately serve as a Civil Rights Attorney and later, U.S. Secretary of Education.

My aspiration is to ensure that education is accessible and equitable for all. Growing up in a community facing systemic inequities, I witnessed how underfunded schools hinder potential. In high school, I founded Lead & Impact: Teen Civic Voices Program, empowering Los Angeles teens to advocate for justice. My work on the LA City Youth Council also influenced local policies on youth services and homelessness. These experiences taught me that systemic change requires advocacy and a solid understanding of law and governance...skills I am eager to develop in college and beyond.

My favorite subject, social justice, has given me the tools to identify historical patterns of oppression and apply critical theory to real-world issues. Derrick Bell's teachings on interest convergence and the Civil Rights Movement inspire me to challenge systems of power through advocacy groups and research. At Northwestern, I plan to continue this work by engaging in

interdisciplinary research, participating in student organizations like For Members Only, and addressing issues of gentrification and displacement in Evanston and Chicago.

As a student leader at Verbum Dei Jesuit High School, I organized monthly principal-parent meetings to bridge communication gaps and improve transparency. I also collaborated with United Way to examine the implications of Measure A a ballot measure focused on housing and mental health, on gentrification, connecting my research to my personal story of witnessing displacement in Compton. Balancing rigorous academics, leadership roles, and personal challenges has taught me how to thrive under pressure. My ability to navigate complex systems while staying grounded in my community's needs ensures that I can lead with both knowledge and empathy.

Looking ahead, I plan to attend law school, focusing on civil rights and education law, and work to break down systemic barriers through policy, preventing underserved communities from accessing quality education. My long-term plan is to serve as U.S. Secretary of Education, where I can advocate for policies on a national scale, ensuring that future generations are equipped to succeed regardless of their circumstances.

The challenges I've faced and overcome have shaped me into a leader who views obstacles as opportunities for growth. With the foundation I've built through my personal experiences, especially in researching policy issues within Los Angeles, academic pursuits, and community advocacy, I am confident in my ability to achieve my goals and make a lasting impact on the world.



In my AP classroom, in the first row, second seat on the left, you can find who is adept at talking—talking about literature, talking about classwork, talking about upcoming tests, talking about EVERYTHING. This is not afraid to speak mind or offer opinion—but always in a charming and disarming way. verbal skills have made a good student, a good thinker, and a master of diplomacy at our school. As a junior in my English 11AP class, readily responded to even the most challenging material, always ready to discuss, explain, and analyze what read. Even after class. would be one of the few students who would hang around to ask good questions or talk more about a topic that needed more discussion, including bold choice of a term paper topic: Ralph Ellison's Invisible Man. final paper was a testament to willingness to work hard and learn the value of good researching and good editing. For each novel unit that I taught, I assigned an AP Criticism which asked students to analyze the structure of the novel, as well as characters, symbols, themes, imagery, and the author's world view. spent a good deal of time making sure that understood every character, every nuance of the novel before critiques. When I taught Heart of Darkness, would write came to class armed with questions revealing not only an understanding of the novel, but also background information that accessed about the novel to make sure that really understood it. Few students would go to such lengths to really "understand" a novel; was just that interested as a reader, that thorough of a student. To prepare for the AP Literature test in May, I gave the students a suggested reading list so that they could read books to prepare for the open novel question. Over winter and spring read additional novels and then wrote practice essays for some of those works at an optional mock AP Lit test that I held on a weekend afternoon. strong work ethic and affinity for analysis helped prepare to pass the AP Literature test (score of 4 as a junior—impressive) and several other AP tests as well. Awarded AP Scholar status as a junior, certainly taps into intellectual curiosity and work ethic to ensure academic success. In July, I taught a college essay summer bootcamp that attended to help focus on the development of voice and style, which will prepare personal college essays and AP English Language this fall. is driven to learn, to develop more for is ready for college matriculation. writing chops, and to success;



Personal Statement.

Growing up in Los Angeles County, I saw firsthand how the way a city is planned can either make life easier or much harder for the people living there. Some areas have well-kept parks, reliable public transportation, and easy access to grocery stores, while others struggle with overcrowded housing, few public resources, and transit systems that don't meet the needs of the community. Seeing these differences made me realize how much urban planning impacts people's daily lives, especially those in lower-income communities. I want to work on making cities more accessible, affordable, and safe—focusing on affordable housing, better public transportation, and creating spaces that truly serve the people who live there.

My interest in urban planning isn't just something I developed from reading or research—it comes from personal experience. In high school, I relied on the city bus to get to school and back home every day. Public transit was my only option, and while it worked, it wasn't always safe. There were multiple times when I felt uncomfortable or even at risk of harm—whether it was being followed after getting off the bus or dealing with people harassing riders, including myself, while we were just trying to get where we needed to go. I remember constantly having to be on alert, texting someone my location, and planning exit strategies just in case. Public transportation is supposed to be a resource that connects people to opportunities, but for many—especially women and young people—it can feel like a risk instead of a benefit.

Experiencing this made me think about how urban planning decisions affect public safety. It's not just about having buses and trains—it's about making sure they are safe, reliable, and actually serve the people who need them. I started paying attention to things like poorly lit bus stops, long wait times, and routes that didn't connect well, which force people into vulnerable situations. I also began to understand how lack of affordable housing pushes people farther away from jobs and schools, making them rely even more on transit systems that aren't designed with their needs in mind.

Beyond urban planning, I've also looked for ways to help people navigate complex systems and understand their rights. By becoming a notary public, I will have the opportunity to assist people—especially those from lower-income backgrounds or with less education—by ensuring they understand the documents they are signing and their legal rights. Many people are taken advantage of simply because they don't have the right information, and I want to use my knowledge to advocate for them and empower them. This experience has reinforced my desire to work in urban planning, where I can fight for policies that protect vulnerable communities and give them better access to resources.

In the future, I want to work on projects that improve access to low-cost resources for communities that need them most. Whether that's expanding affordable housing, improving public transportation, or making sure every neighborhood has parks and grocery stores, my goal is to help create cities that are more livable and fair for everyone.

A person's access to good housing and transportation shouldn't depend on their income, and I want to help shape policies and projects that make sure all communities—especially those that have historically been overlooked—get the investment and attention they deserve.

Los Angeles is a city with so much potential, but it also has deep inequalities that need to be addressed. I'm excited to pursue additional education in urban planning, where I can gain the skills and knowledge to help make cities more affordable, connected, and safe for future generations.

Diagnosed with selective mutism in second grade, I had mastered the art of being unheard and unseen. Voicing to anyone outside of my immediate family was a herculean task. The sound of my voice seemed more like a stranger than a friend. The transition to middle school served as a catalyst to break through personally and sparked a period of growth that reshaped how I hear myself and where my voice has a place in my community.

It started with a paradoxical decision to join my middle school debate club, a club which required the active and deliberate use of my voice. In the beginning, I clung on tightly to my usual silence, terrified and unable to activate my vocal cord in front of other peers. Hanging on to the desire to break through and with the guidance of patient high school mentors, I began to activate my voice and hear its impact. Near the end of my first year in the club, I was not just speaking, I was debating with confidence. As one who once avoided eye contact and communicated via whispers, this transformation felt monumental to me. It was my first glimpse into how communication could open doors, connect people, and drive change.

The realization that my voice had a place in my immediate surroundings deepened when I became a mentor in my high school's Debate Outreach Program as a first-year student. Returning to my middle school as a mentor and guiding the first-time debaters on how to articulate their thoughts forced me to further refine my own communication skills. I could not rely on jargon or vague advice; I had to meet students where they were and tailored my feedback to their needs. Witnessing their growth —just as I had with my own growth—was deeply rewarding. In that moment, I learned the importance of empathy and adaptability in building connections with others.

My confidence in the use of my voice boosted when the City of Walnut Council appointed me as a Youth Advisory Commissioner in my sophomore and junior years. As a Youth Advisory Commissioner, I represented young residents' voices in my community. This experience reinforced my understanding of how vital it is for everyone's opinions to be heard and valued and how collective input can lead to meaningful outcomes. Taking the initiative, I also set up an internship with the City of Walnut's Community Development Department during my senior year, where I witnessed firsthand how development planning decisions shaped communities and the quality of life for the residents. These public service roles have provided me with a profound sense of satisfaction and a sense of purpose since day one.

Overcoming selective mutism gave me a heartfelt appreciation for the power of communication, and it shaped my desire to help create neighborhoods where everyone could thrive. I realized that the challenges I faced as an individual mirrored larger issues within the greater communities. This connection is what drives my passion in the public service field. I

hope to pursue my college education in civil engineering or urban planning where I can help build and influence communities through building strong connections, open communications and encouraging active participation of the stakeholders affected. While I may not have the perfect path already planned out, I know that the knowledge and skills I have gained through my education, work experiences, and unexpected challenges, will lead me to my destination.



The cold, protracted concrete platform of Pomona North train station is certainly not the prettiest sight to commence your day, yet it's where my mornings begin. The roughly 4 hours a day I spend on the train to school in Los Angeles and the evening ride right back haven't always been the most treasured moments of my day, yet I owe the intense fascination I have for philosophy—and for the experiences of others—to the lousy ole' commuter train.

The commuter train is a place where strange voices ring out from the mouths around you, where you sit on strange-colored seats stained by strange substances of the past, and hear strange noises from both the rumbling train engine and the computers in the seats behind you.

Businessmen in pinstripe suits perch in seats right behind the unhoused, construction workers with dusty hands find conversation with high school students on their way back home (construction workers really do tell the best stories). The traincarts in which I've spent countless hours of countless days riding are a setting where I get to witness so many lives intersect, sharing one track despite how much the tracks of their lives diverge. These sundry lived experiences captivate me, drawing my attention and stimulating my mind with questions that for much of my life, I'd never think to ask. It's a far, far cry from the days when the commuter train was the object of my detestation.

As far in the past as it often feels, there was once a time where the constants of my day had nothing to do with the commuter train: I'd been driven around by my parents frolicking in a cocoon of a life with much ease and little challenge. My worldview was only as elaborate as my parent's front-seat conservations, only as nuanced as the jokes and quips from Steve Harvey booming through the radio. Little did I know then that there'd come a day where I felt much like Plato's man leaving the deep, dark cave he once called home: the day I first boarded the commuter train. Yes, a rude awakening awaited me on the station platform, and a raw, unpolished reality: the stories of strangers weren't confined to the newsreel, but were living, breathing realities unfolding right before my eyes.

I haven't yet ascertained whether I ended up riding the commuter train by a stroke of luck, or the result of some greater calling. Whatever the truth may be, I'm forever thankful for this "curse" of mine. In the days when I was still getting used to my routine, I thought often of a life where, but I know now that this just wouldn't do: the world is at capacity with those who simply stick to their own. You can shy away from the uncomfortable parts of society, but I've come to realize that the greatest insights lie in discord with others, in the multitude of opinions I'd never before call mine. There may be a reality where I stayed in the cave, in the warmth of my parent's car, but I've come to realize that sitting with strangers has expanded my perspective beyond measure. These discomfited moments of life gifted to me my empathy, and the grimy windows of the commuter train have given me a lens through which I can approach the world around me with openness, and with a real curiosity. That vast, internal distance that lies between the people beside me on the street, in waiting rooms, in lobbies, all comes down with this constant exposure to people and personalities I'd otherwise never have the opportunity to regard.

I hope to ride the train in college—whether my college town has public transit or not. The MTA or Chicago loop would do fine, but I don't believe I *need* an engine or steel tracks at all. I've stood witness to the diverse expanse that is the *American* train. I carry with me now a fascination for the ideologies of others, for the moments in their lives that have shaped their beliefs, the reasons they believe what they believe, and how these individuals' ideas shape our larger society. The train has shown me the sheer depth of our nation, but even more than that, it has given me the ability to commit to a study that continues past the train cart, far from Pomona North's concrete platform, and to which I'm dedicating at least the next half-decade of my academic life. The tracks I ride along may not lead to Union Station—opting rather for perhaps our nation's Capital, the expansive library of a university, or the counsel table of a courtroom—yet wherever my destination lies, I think I'll stay on the train through it all.

#### Personal Statement

"Optimal" isn't just an adjective—it's a lens through which I view the world. I was first captivated by this perspective when my dad explained Dijkstra's algorithm using an imaginary example: deducing a pizza delivery man's shortest route. From childhood until now, I savored every challenge and discovered an enthusiasm for finding efficient solutions.

My instinct to optimize kicked in while dumping empty duster cans were dumped into the recycling bin. Although compressed air dusters were our savior for quickly cooling our robot, and a competition staple, the practice was wasteful and accumulated heavy expenses throughout the season. After returning from the competition, I racked my brain for alternative solutions. A normal fan would be a simple substitute, but it would barely help under a time crunch. If only our worktable could simultaneously cool the robot...could it?

I sketched out my idea: a wide, flat-surfaced fan that also serves as a repair table for maintenance between matches. Since supporting a robot required a sturdy structure, I borrowed metal alloy beams from the spare parts of my 3D printer to form a base by drilling holes and fastening screws from our robot's supply. Leftover computer fans from my PC build lined the inside to generate sufficient airflow. Then came my favorite part: recounting from physics lectures, I designed a circuit to connect the individual fans and link them to a control switch. With my blueprint, I soldered the components and tucked the wires neatly into place. To finish off, I installed a grate on top to prevent the blades from slicing loose parts—or curious fingers—and switched it on.

It's working! As the whirring fans sped up along with my excitement, I introduced our eager builders to their new workstation. My invention not only alleviated our budget and reduced waste; the process developed my creative and resourceful mindset for future endeavors.

Extending into real-world practice through my research work—in pursuit of improving computer vision for autonomous vehicles—I applied this mindset when training machine learning models with large bathces of data. We encountered excessively slow speeds when uploading our 3D point cloud files to a processing website. To improve this, I investigated and set up the processing server on my own computer, efficiently reducing the time from hours to minutes. After introducing this method to my peers and watching their faces light up, I realized that optimization is more than a skill; it has become an enduring passion and a piece of my second nature.

The next target? Energy. Powering the machine learning models, robots, and pizza-delivery cars, our overconsumption of fossil fuels dangerously exploits the health and resources of our planet. However, access to feasible, sustainable energy is limited for the majority of the population. We need to develop cost-effective, scalable renewable energy sources for the future—and I believe research in plasma fusion provides an answer. I hope to contribute to this field by employing my experience in machine learning, physics, and engineering to explore new possibilities for sustainable energy and optimize the future.







Minimum 500-word personal statement describing your interest in community planning, regional planning, urban planning, civil engineering, political science, public administration, sustainable development, or other related fields and future career goals.

My entry into political science and community planning began this past summer after my ninth grade year when I attended a leadership academy hosted by City Councilmember Paul Krekorian. The experience provided me with the opportunity to visit various city agencies, including the police department, fire department, and Metro, culminating in my attendance at a City Council meeting. As I toured each agency and learned about the policies that guided their operations, I became increasingly intrigued by how societal policies are written and enforced.

The City Council meeting was especially informative, giving me a real sense of the policies shaping my community and their tangible impact on residents. The final hour of the session had the greatest impact on me, as it was dedicated to public comments. The most frequent complaint that day concerned the 6th Street Viaduct. Though it was designed to improve traffic flow and provide community facilities and green spaces, the viaduct had remained closed since its construction due to a series of unforeseen issues.

During the public comment period, an elderly gentleman approached the microphone to ask about potential policies to address the nighttime disturbances caused by motorcyclists on the bridge, as well as the increasing number of homeless encampments. Council members assured him that they would seriously address these concerns and implement policies to mitigate the issues in a timely manner. I later learned through a news report that the giant park and other facilities, including the landmark sculpture below the 6th Avenue Bridge, are scheduled for completion in 2026. This experience highlighted the evolving nature of large-scale projects and how they can become pressing neighborhood concerns.

Urban planning and policy-making in such development projects have since become intellectual interests of mine. I am eager to understand how cities balance community demands with infrastructure expansion and how policy decisions shape the urban landscape for decades to come.

My interest in policy and planning was further deepened through my work with social service programs. While volunteering at PALS, a program where I spent a week with teens with Down syndrome, I began to wonder about the disability policies and strategies in place to promote full societal integration and prevent discrimination. Similarly, as president of Liberty in North Korea, an organization that raises awareness about North Korean refugees, I have developed a strong interest in policies affecting refugees and immigrants in the U.S., particularly in Los Angeles. These experiences have helped me realize how policies can either include or exclude vulnerable groups, shaping the very fabric of our communities.

The debate over the 6th Street Viaduct exemplifies the kind of complex urban planning challenge that requires thoughtful policy solutions. Observing how council members navigated

the situation—balancing infrastructural requirements, neighborhood concerns over noise and homelessness, and long-term visions for community amenities—demonstrated the multifaceted nature of city governance. It illustrated that successful urban planning requires not only technical expertise but also political acumen and a genuine sensitivity to human concerns.

My experiences in disability advocacy and refugee support have also shown me how policies can either facilitate or hinder social inclusion. I have witnessed firsthand how accessible design, inclusive education, and supportive social services can improve the daily lives of marginalized individuals. Conversely, I have seen how policy gaps or misplaced priorities can perpetuate cycles of inequality and exclusion.

After earning a political science degree, I plan to be actively involved in policy-making to foster equitable communities and improve overall quality of life. I am particularly interested in the intersection of urban planning and social policy, where infrastructure development directly impacts equity, accessibility, and public health.

Whether working in local government, a community development corporation, or a policy research think tank, I want to contribute to thoughtful planning that prioritizes inclusive growth and sustainable development. My goal is to help build communities that embrace diversity, where human needs shape infrastructure, and where policies are crafted with long-term social impact in mind.








From an early age I have been fascinated by grassroots political activism and civil engineering. My passion for community development and infrastructure has led me to seek opportunities to build resilient and sustainable communities. Through local political engagement, STEM education, and mentorship programs like ACE I have developed a strong interest in how urban planning and public administration shape daily life. My commitment to political activism began when I became Chief of Operations for a grassroots campaign in San Gabriel. I coordinated canvassing, organized community events, and facilitated policy discussions with residents. I saw the power of civic engagement in addressing issues like housing and transportation. Working with community members showed me the need for policies that reflect diverse needs. It also reinforced my belief that collaboration between policymakers, engineers, and residents is essential for effective governance. At the same time my interest in civil engineering grew through STEM education programs like Gabrielino Stemster and ACE. Teaching younger students about engineering helped me explore infrastructure's role in urban planning and sustainability. Through ACE I worked with professionals on real-world projects that deepened my understanding of structural design and transportation planning. This experience showed me how engineering and public policy intersect to create equitable urban spaces. Limited public transit creates significant barriers for low-income residents restricting access to jobs, education, healthcare and essential services. Poorly planned and underfunded transit networks leave many communities disconnected, reinforcing economic and social inequalities. Additionally San Gabriel's roads suffer from years of neglect due to insufficient funding and lack of coordinated maintenance efforts further limiting mobility and safety. Addressing these issues requires both political advocacy and engineering expertise. I want to develop policies and infrastructure projects that prioritize accessibility sustainability and economic growth. By integrating grassroots activism with civil engineering I aim to work alongside local governments, transportation agencies and community organizations to create transit-oriented development initiatives that improve public transit, promote affordable housing near transit hubs and enhance walkability. Beyond immediate transportation improvements I am passionate about building climate-resilient infrastructure that supports long-term urban sustainability. This includes advocating for green infrastructure such as bike lanes, pedestrian-friendly streets and energy-efficient public transit solutions that reduce carbon emissions and support a more livable urban environment. Looking ahead I hope to contribute to sustainable urban development by leveraging both technical engineering solutions and policy-driven strategies to create equitable connected and thriving communities. My goal is to ensure that community voices play a central role in shaping urban planning while using engineering innovations to build more efficient and equitable cities. Infrastructure projects succeed when the communities they serve are actively involved in the decision-making process. Too often marginalized groups are excluded from planning discussions which leads to transit systems and public works that fail to meet the needs of the people who rely on them most. Limited public input results in projects that displace vulnerable populations, ignore accessibility concerns and reinforce economic and social disparities. By combining political organizing with civil engineering I hope to advocate for policies that prioritize public needs and create infrastructure that genuinely serves its users. This means pushing for participatory planning processes where residents particularly those from underserved communities have a say in how their neighborhoods are developed. It also involves working with local governments and transportation agencies to secure funding for projects that enhance mobility, expand public transit and improve road safety. Pursuing a degree in urban planning, public administration or civil engineering will give me the technical knowledge and policy expertise needed to address these challenges. Through coursework I want to develop a strong foundation in transportation systems, environmental sustainability and equitable city planning. Through research I aim to explore innovative infrastructure solutions that reduce congestion, minimize environmental impact and improve public safety. Fieldwork and hands-on projects will allow me to collaborate with professionals and community leaders to implement real-world solutions.





#### SCAG Scholarship Essay |

As an aspiring changemaker and community leader, I hope to someday pursue a career located at the intersection of engineering, sustainability, and community impact, and to me, civil engineering and sustainable development perfectly align with these goals. These fields are about far more than just about constructing buildings and roads—they're about shaping the future of our cities to be more sustainable, accessible, and resilient. Through my experiences in competitive engineering projects, public policy research, and advocacy for sustainable development, I've developed a blazing passion for civil engineering and sustainable development as tools for driving positive change throughout my community.

My interest in these fields first began through the "Greening Cities, Sustaining Lives" competition, hosted by the British International Education Association. As my team's founder, I led our members of diverse interests and backgrounds through designing sustainable infrastructure centered around the city of Dallas, Texas, where one of my teammates lived. Through the experience, I saw firsthand how infrastructure creates the backbone for our communities, and I learned to manage critical concerns like costs, feasibility, environmental impact, and disability accessibility to create the best possible designs for our project. Our team won Second Prize in the competition, which was the highest award won by any US team that year—but far more importantly than the award itself, our project's success ignited my belief that thoughtful engineering can transform communities and enhance quality-of-life for their inhabitants.

Eager to continue exploring sustainable engineering, the next year I founded and led another student research team, and together, we developed an innovative technology aimed at making transportation more environmentally friendly—specifically by creating an alternative to harmful chemicals used by airlines. Our work earned us recognition as Pete Conrad Scholars in the global Conrad Challenge, semifinalists in the Diamond Challenge, and 3rd place winners in the UCLA Nanovation Competition. These experiences also won me invitations to present to and conference with industry experts at NASA and UCLA, providing me with valuable insight into how cutting-edge engineering can be leveraged for sustainability. Beyond pure engineering work, I also led our team in developing business and revenue models, applying for government grants, and pursuing a patent, giving me hands-on insight into the process of transforming new technologies into widely-implemented solutions.

Beyond hands-on engineering, I also have a firm interest in public policy and awareness related to sustainable engineering projects. For instance, last summer I interned at NASA, where I analyzed global space agencies' compliance with international regulations and proposed policy solutions for noncompliance; I realized these regulations are important in ensuring satellites and other space technologies are properly managed, to prevent the accumulation of space debris and pollution. This experience highlighted the critical role of governance in ensuring that engineering projects align with broader environmental and societal goals. Furthermore, my work as an educational writer at DemiDec has provided me with new avenues for deepening my understanding of sustainability in a global framework. This year, I was selected as the lead author of a specialized research project on climate change, where I examined how policymakers and engineers can collaborate to address global sustainability challenges. My writing reached an

audience of over 1,000 schools nationwide, empowering me to raise awareness about pressing climate issues in an accessible way.



I didn't always know the term "civil engineering," but I've always been fascinated with how the design and interaction of buildings, bridges, and roads can give a city or neighborhood its character. When building my junior year schedule and discussing career interests with my counselor, she recommended the course Introduction to the Principles of Engineering. My interest in how numbers and measurements are used for real-world applications aligned with the class curriculum. The hands-on activities and software programs made learning exciting. I have since taken all the engineering, math, and physics courses available but found the most empowering experiences outside the classroom. While attending the 9th Annual Girls' Engineering Day, hosted by Women's Transportation Seminar's Orange County Chapter, I was excited to learn that I could pursue both a college degree and a career in this area, specifically in seismic engineering. In this profession, there's a strong sense of selflessness and a strong desire to serve humanity, which aligns with my personal values.

During a trip to Mexico to visit my family, I saw firsthand the destruction earthquakes had on poorly constructed buildings using outdated building materials and technology. 

"Have commitment because you are passionate." These are the words of encouragement I have received from my mom throughout my high school career. At the end of the COVID-19 pandemic, my 8th grade year ended and I would begin 9th grade. Having been enclosed and only seen through social media the impact of politics and modern-day issues, I wanted to inform myself by participating in my community. Before officially taking part in community and youth commission meetings, I wanted to ensure I was fully informed about the work environment I would be in on a regular basis.





During the pandemic, I was confined to the spaces of my home and neighborhood. After a couple months of quarantine, I had enough and decided I wanted to explore more of my world. I started walking around the block, then expanded to surrounding neighborhoods. Eventually, my walking trips became miles long, and I immediately noticed that the arterial and collector streets I had been walking on were noisy and dangerous. I didn't feel that I was supposed to be walking along these streets, and drivers would stare at me wondering why I wasn't in a car. I also noticed how spread apart everything was. The nearest McDonald's location and Westminster Mall were both forty-five minutes away by walking. The middle school that I attended and the nearest library were half an hour away by walking (on loud and congested roads). Although it would have been much faster to bike to these locations, there was no bicycle infrastructure on Westminster's roads at the time (city ordinances did not allow riding a bike on sidewalks). Everything required driving.

Having seen all these issues, I felt like I wanted to do something about them but I had no idea how I could make my city a safer place. I was very interested in a game called "Cities: Skylines". I had been watching videos of content creators playing these games and solving issues like those I had experienced within my community. In this game, I was able to play with land zoning and the different types of streets, which really fed my creativity. I had to figure out which type of street was appropriate for each application, like a neighborhood or business district. I loved being able to organize my city by separating it into several districts or wards. The best and most exciting aspect of playing this game was being able to build a public transit system and seeing the public transit system that I had put so much work into being used by the people who lived in my city. The game had an option by which I could simulate the life of a random resident within my city in first-person point-of-view. So sometimes, I would just simply play this role and analyze the streets that they would walk and the busses they ride. If the resident had encountered problems along their trip, I would find myself trying my best to repair the issue. The game also had certain analytical tools (e.g. traffic flow, city attractiveness, noise levels, pollution) that I would use to hammer out problems that were affecting my residents. But sometimes, I would be stumped by a certain problem that would pop up. To work around this roadblock, I would just go to YouTube and watch videos from the channel Not Just Bikes, and TikTok videos by @streetcraft. These creators have widened my comprehension and educated me about urban planning concepts I had never before heard of. I would utilize these recently-learned concepts to work around those roadblocks. These creators have widened my comprehension and educated me about urban planning concepts I had never before heard of. I would utilize these recently-learned concepts to work around those roadblocks. I especially loved the short-form yet detailed TikTok videos by @everydayengineering. He would discuss the work that went into creating new roundabouts, raised crosswalks, and protected bike lanes in New Haven, Connecticut. His videos were very inspiring. I wanted to do what he did, to create safe intersections and crosswalks for Westminster.

In high school, I joined "Upward Bound", an after-school program by which students are able to get support for their homework, mentor underclassmen, and tour colleges. I began talking to my college and career counsellor about what I wanted to study in college and pursue in the future. As I described why I believed civil engineering was the right major for me, he interrupted me and said what I was describing sounds more like city planning. He showed me the city and regional planning program at California Polytechnic State University of San Luis Obispo. As I explored the school's website and read the degree requirements, I realized that I had found my dream job. I began to frequently meet with my counsellor to plan my courses at Westminster High School so that I could prepare for an education at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. I planned to take Engineering & Design courses and Drafting courses, as well as physics and chemistry. I wanted to be ready to pursue my career.

But the path for me to pursue my career was incredibly rocky and tumultuous. Transitioning to high school was a challenge for me. During my freshman year, I was gravely disappointed by my academic performance. I spiralled even more the following year. I was not used to the rigor of AP- and honors-level courses. Simply rage-quitting after becoming confounded on a homework problem was a major bad habit of mine during my sophomore year. It became such an issue that I eventually stopped doing my homework assignments altogether. Thinking I would eventually do them, loads of assignments would be backlogged on a sticky note; they would remain incomplete. This naturally resulted in abysmal exam and quiz performance, and I would be let down by the results. In the end, I failed chemistry and trigonometry. This was shocking to me. I had never failed any classes before and deluded myself into thinking I would pull my head out of the sand. To change that, I started to focus on my work ethic. The first significant thing I wanted was to pass chemistry and trigonometry. During the summer when I was a rising junior, I took a preparatory chemistry course to start off redoing my failed classes. When the school year started, I was taking chemistry (AP) and precalculus. I had assumed that just

doing precalculus was enough, but eventually decided on taking two credit recovery algebra II classes to further boost my GPA and for retribution. I was much more attentive in my classes, and lessons started making sense and completing assignments felt less like a chore. Even if I got stuck on a homework problem, I would persevere and work with friends to resolve the misunderstanding. I spent more time at tutoring with Upward Bound and would make the effort to ask for help. I passed AP Chemistry with A-grades in both semesters and the official AP exam itself with a 3.

After establishing consistent academic habits, I was inclined to do more. At the same time I got my driving license, I created my own website aimed at discussing Westminster's urban-planning-related problems. To gather the data and information that I needed to discuss these problems, I would bring with me a notepad and explore Orange County as much as I could. Even if I were just driving to school or any event, I paid attention to the traffic signal phases and the general safety of the intersection. I constantly think about ways any street or intersection could be improved as I'm driving along. I have gathered information about how long red lights were at select intersections in Westminster. These traffic lights would remain red, even though there was no cross traffic that could be possibly actuating the loops on the ground or the cameras on the poles to keep these lights unchanged. Furthermore, I recognize that roads are very loud and walking down Beach Boulevard can be very unnerving. Using a decibel meter, I measured the noise levels of Beach Boulevard. They ranged from approximately 75 dB to 84 dB. That's barely less than the level of noise that is considered dangerous. Speeding down Culver Drive, or any arterial street like it, is a very common occurrence. The flow of traffic is usually at least five miles per hour above the speed limit, but there is always an abundance of drivers who will work their hardest to maintain their speed of 15 miles per hour over the speed limit.

I would analyze the gathered information afterwards (to see whether my hypothesis was correct or incorrect) and expand on them in passages, which I would then publish on my website. In each publication, I would explore and examine potential solutions to these problems. However, I would eventually realize the cost of making these changes and the bureaucratic tape that I needed to work through in order to make these changes happen if I were to ever become an urban planner. Therefore, I needed to learn more about how the government and the politics of policymaking. I came across an opportunity to participate in a political campaign wherein Derek Tran challenged then congresswoman Michelle Steel for CA\$45, a battleground congressional district. My initial goals for volunteering with the Derek Tran for Congress campaign was to gain experience in policy to better understand our government, and develop leadership and communication skills so that I can be an effective and efficient lead on future infrastructure projects.

Derek Tran was able to unseat Michelle Steel by more than 500 votes. I'm proud to have been a part of his campaign since February 2024 through volunteering, fellowships, and internships. I started volunteering for the campaign at the UVSA Tet Festival, where I highlighted his strong democratic values and why he would be a good fit for our district. Because of my effective messaging, I was invited to join a team to canvass a neighborhood in Fullerton. Canvassers were given a script that talked about national issues; voters weren't engaged with these talking points, dismissing me because they were the same points they've heard on the news. My community consists of immigrants who've experienced political traumas. The campaign's script didn't address the concerns of my community. I decided to use my own talking points, focusing on the older generation's fears of communism and their reliance on government safety nets (Social Security, Obamacare, and SNAP/EBT benefits). People were more receptive of what I had to say about Tran once I changed the script to reflect their values. Because of my success in getting constituents to support Derek, a field organizer asked me to join a paid fellowship for the campaign. I was asked to aid in training some of the other fellows due to my canvassing experiences. The fellows had no direction so they struggled to start canvassing. I taught them the canvassing etiquette and annotated their scripts to make them more human and improve their messaging. After the fellowship ended in August, I joined Grassroots Democrats HQ to intern for the campaign, where I continued to campaign and train new canvassers each weekend until Election Day.

I believe working for the Southern California Association of Government and California Transportation Foundation is a fortuitous opportunity for me. I have always wanted to first-hand experience the fields of regional planning, civil engineering, and public administration. I feel a call to serve my community, and I want to work towards making local infrastructure more safe and efficient. I have academic experience in engineering and design. I have demonstrated my duty to serve my county and state by volunteering for political campaigns. I have experience analyzing California's infrastructure to propose methods to improve it. I aim to bring my vision for California's infrastructure to fruition to better

support my community and make cities much more environmentally and financially sustainable. This scholarship is the perfect opportunity for me to develop the skills needed so that I can eventually make a contribution to southern California's streets. I believe this state deserves an infrastructure that can support its passion, life, diversity, and beauty.



#### **Personal Statement**

Upon starting high school, I envisioned a journey filled with excitement, opportunity, leadership, friendships, and success. The feeling of being unseen, unheard, and disconnected from my peers weighed heavily on me and my mental leading me into a deep depression. I struggled to find my purpose questioning where I belonged and how I could create change in a space that often felt unwelcoming.

It was through this experience that I found my passion for advocacy and community building. Instead of allowing my circumstances and environment to define me, I chose to take action, and it felt good driving my interest in advocacy. While implementing change is not easy, I founded my school's first Black Student Union to create a space where students who looked like me could feel supported, valued, and empowered. Scholarship Personal Statement

To whom it may concern at The Southern California Association of Governments,

As a Political Science major eager to make a difference in civic and public affairs, I am eager to move forward with my biggest passion of advocacy and am aiming for a bachelor's in Political Science, to pursue a career in Environmental Law. I have familiarized myself with the major by taking prerequisite courses and attending community events, which have helped me learn the value of making informed decisions regarding civic engagement. Through my presence and dedication within the community at Norco College, I have found the underlying meaning of being a Political Science major. My integration has solidified my desire to connect with politics to create a change in environmental laws, and your aid will help me sustain that when I transfer to a four-year institution this fall.

The start of my career in sustainable and public planning began in 2023 with Fashion For Change, a club I created, which focuses on teaching other students the importance of sustainability. I envisioned collecting used clothes on campus, repurposing them through sewing, and reselling them to buy sewing machines for the school. Over the three months of my 2023 fall semester, I had interviews with multiple different student peers who had the same vision I did and brought 6 other amazing candidates along with me. In the spring, we collected twenty 27-gallon containers filled with used clothing, shoes, bags, and other accessories. We donated half to shelters and sold the other half at NOMU, the Norco Music and Arts Festival. The proceeds amounted to about 600 dollars, which we used to purchase sewing machines available to anyone starting next spring. The reception Fashion For Change has received is so large that after a year and a half of dedication, the club has 80 members.

Creating a club that navigates similarly to a non-profit has taught me that communities need people to represent their issues and work toward change. Using my political education, I showed people that instead of blaming themselves, they should direct their feelings toward creating change in all politically influenced areas, including fashion. Through advocating for sustainability, I began hearing opinions and understanding the backgrounds of other peers, which inspired me to take action and find a place on campus where people can bring their concerns and get answers. As someone who prefers to have hands-on experience, I chose to start networking with other students and ran for the Pre-Law Political Science President. After being elected, I put in effort to build the club's leadership, creating a space for political science majors to communicate and understand topics and career fields.

Additionally, I joined the student body government at Norco College and learned how small-scale politics operate. There I began to meet people like me, and I finally found enough security within myself to communicate about my passion to ignite societal change. One of the many tasks the student body had, involved registering students to vote. As a team, we were failing to reach the community, and our director recognized this failure and decided to engage students through voter education. I took the position offered to me as a Student Voter Education Coordinator.

With an election around the corner, I contacted local politicians such as Corona City Mayor, Tom Richins and Jurupa Valley Mayor, Guillermo Silva. Although sometimes I felt politics wasn't reaching students because of defamiliarization, I worked to communicate with students on the importance of involvement in local politics. I built a team of volunteers and used their help to teach what different ballot measures meant, including our school district's Bond Measure CC. Per the request of our Chancellor, Wolde Ab-Isaac, I collaborated with connecting district schools and reached hundreds of students who ultimately registered and voted in the November election. Setting the stage to expose me and my student peers to leaders in political offices has opened the doors to understanding advocacy and bureaucracy at a macro level.

Working alongside a team of like-minded individuals who share a humanistic understanding of political structures has given me the foundation to expand my knowledge and engage in research as I advance to upper-division courses at the university level. Before getting involved, I struggled to find my place, but now I recognize that the skills and dedication I have developed both on campus and at work off campus will be invaluable in pursuing my passion for protecting our home—Earth. This scholarship will enable me to continue my education at a four-year institution, empowering me to advocate for the very foundation of our existence and protection. With this support, I am deeply motivated to further my studies and lead the way in advocacy for others as a Political Science major.





### Personal Statement

As someone raised right by the heart of the Inland Empire, I've had firsthand experiences of both the good and bad in urban planning and development. Many times throughout my life I've found myself craving a more accessible, walkable, and easy to explore city that incentivizes being outside and visiting a new corner of the city every day. This, compounded by the potential I realized when visiting the wonderful city of Tokyo, has been a major motivator in my pursuing a career in Civil Engineering (and more specifically, Transportation Engineering).

I absolutely love trains in almost every aspect. I love how they look, especially the sleek and rounded design of modern trains. I love how they shape development, and their history in making the state of California the powerhouse it is today, and shaping our cities, especially cities like Los Angeles. I love how convenient and affordable they can be, as opposed to being stuck in traffic with a vehicle that requires constant maintenance. I love how they promote walkability, allowing businesses to form around stations and be easily accessible without the troubles of motor traffic. And most importantly, I love how efficient trains are, moving tons of people at a fraction of the space, energy, and time (sometimes) that it would take otherwise. This love for trains is what motivates me to get a career in Civil Engineering, so I can be one of the people

And there is no line that extends down to San Diego at all in the area. I know all these benefits that exist around trains, yet I see that development in the area has been slow to nonexistent, and I want to make a difference and improve the region.

My goal in pursuing a degree in Civil Engineering is to come back with the knowledge and experience I gained and be someone who promotes a change in the way SoCal handles transportation. I've seen and learned firsthand the benefits of a strong, mixed transportation network, and I believe that with a strong education I will be able to help bring what I've seen here, applying my passion for transportation to make a difference in the community. While I want to focus primarily on Transportation Engineering, I know that a well-rounded education in Civil Engineering will allow me to understand the nuances and constraints that surround the





The flyer read: "Are you thinking about becoming an engineer? Or an architect?... What about becoming an URBAN PLANNER?!?"

These papers were handed out at a "Careers in Planning" symposium at my community college. I did not think attending an event for extra-credit, with only three people and one tray of peanuts, would be life-changing ....

But it was.

The moment it started everything they said ticked all the boxes in my head. "Work alongside the public." Check. "Tackle housing and transportation needs." Check. "Implement sustainable practices." Check. "Create local and national change." Check. I saw myself in the speakers because they showed determination to fix the mistakes of the past and create a better future for their communities. This experience was the catalyst for my interest in planning.

Afterwards, I immediately dove into a rabbit hole of urban planning books, podcasts and videos. Reading *The Social Life of Small Urban Spaces* by William Whyte and *Walkable City* by Jeff Speck were pivotal for me because they changed my perception of the world around me. They pushed me to question what makes a space feel inviting, why many areas in my city lack these components, and how these conditions can change? As I delved deeper into planning and saw how it is intertwined with a variety of subjects, it started to stand out to me as a potential career. When I was discovering different career paths in my first year of college, I would often go back and forth between jobs such as architect, sustainability coordinator, and environmental engineer because I was interested in a swath of topics including environmental science, politics, community building, and public health. My research into the planning field revealed that this career can tap into my generalist mindset because its city scale requires planners to address broad issues. The way the field pushed me to examine my surroundings was eye-opening, and seeing how it can tackle various complex issues influenced me to learn more outside my self-study.

Since my college does not have urban planning courses, I decided to further my knowledge of this career by pursuing an internship at the City of Riverside Planning Division. My first-hand experiences at the city solidified my interest in planning because I see how planners genuinely care for the community and strive to build a sustainable future. Thanks to my internship, I also had the privilege to attend the 2024 California APA Conference. By participating in discussions with other students and professionals, this event taught me that the planning field allows itself to be self-critical. It acknowledges its successes and failings and encourages new discourse and perspectives. I believe that the field's inquisitive nature and receptiveness towards change is its greatest strength and ultimately where my passion for planning stems from. Planning's ever-changing landscape makes the career exciting because — in addition to what is taught at university — there is far more I can learn in the field.

After immersing myself in this profession, I developed a love for city planning because it fosters a culture of critique and reflection, tackles a wide array of issues, and evolves overtime. In my career my main goal is to improve the quality of life for both people and the planet, and I believe that becoming a planner is the best way to achieve this. Therefore, I applied to Cal Poly Pomona as an Urban and Regional Planning major and I am currently waiting to transfer in Fall 2025. As for the area I grew up in I already see many ways in which it can improve. Once I finish my studies, I plan to come back and work in the Inland Empire so I can continue being an active member in local issues and directly improve the lives of the community.

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



### SCAG Personal Statement

I love the state of California. When it comes to my residence in this world, I am an American, sure. But above all, I am Californian. In my world, my Tahiti is Newport Beach, my Marseille is San Francisco, my Sahara is the Mojave, my Himalayas are the Sierra Nevadas, and the very center of all of it is Los Angeles, California. My passion for this state, particularly Southern California, is boundless. For that reason, investing into SoCal's future has become the primary purpose in my life. I intend to do so through a career as a Civil Engineer.

Throughout high school, I have gained a major appreciation and interest for urban planning and cities. I learned a lot about great urbanism; About what makes cities special, what gives them an identity and makes a particular city a desirable place to live. I learned a lot about what influences its development; About zoning, about city ordinances, and about the individual histories that have affected different cities today. For a while, this knowledge drew me to cities in Europe, as well as cities in the Northeast United States. However, that lens of urban planning ultimately led me back to where I've been all along, Southern California. The potential for urban development projects particularly in LA is massive. The Greater LA Area will be forced to make changes in the way it develops its cities in response to issues such as lack of transportation options, and the housing crisis. My career goal is to be involved in ensuring that these issues are dealt with in a way that effectively solves the problem, as well as preserving the unique culture that defines this beautiful region of the world. That is what motivates me to be a part of investing into SoCal's future, making the region I love the best it can possibly be.

Nowadays, the historical downtown of Lake Elsinore is treated more as a novelty, not as a central business district, the city instead opting more towards big-box centers. This process that is common for many cities in the USA has been a major factor in passion for being a part of SoCal's future. It is extremely important to me that addressing the issues that SoCal faces is done with care and a knowledge of the culture of the region.

With this goal in mind, the natural career that follows my aspirations is Civil

Engineering, specifically, working in regional rail. Civil Engineering is the natural combination
for my knowledge in math and physics, as well as my great enthusiasm for California cities. I am
passionate about rail because I feel it is a sustainable addition to a city's transportation options.

am beckoned to play in the process of ensuring SoCal stays the charming place that it is.







Unfortunately, my parents knew nothing about this because they were working to provide for me and my sister. I never told them about this until recently because I felt embarrassed. I was embarrassed that I could not help myself. It's sad to say that I could help others grow and fix the problems they had but I couldn't. The things they would say to me made me crave academic validation and when I found myself doing less than that I would beat myself up and cry. As I started to distance myself and move away from them the academic validation stuck and it caused me to always want to compete with my peers. If someone I knew was doing better than me then my mind would fill with negative thoughts such as not making it to college or not being able to graduate. As I grew I started to stop caring because I realized no one cared about "winning" as much as I did. I say that this is a significant struggle that has deeply impacted my life because, at certain points in my life, I think that I am not only letting myself down but the people who bullied me. I think that it's always hard when you let someone who thinks or acts like they are higher than you win. This struggle has also shaped me because it made me realize what I want to do with my future. As I mentioned before A lot of people find it hard to help themselves and I am one of those people. I have always found it easier to help others and ignore my problems because it seems to me like I have accomplished something. I want to become a lawyer to help people find themselves or fix whatever went wrong in their lives. I have always had a true passion for helping others and I know that becoming a lawyer will ultimately give me the life goal I have always set for myself. Becoming a lawyer is not just a job that makes money to me. Being a lawyer is a lifestyle you have to be willing to take. A job that will not only help me better myself but the future of others and the ones around them. Teenagers can not find the need to want or to ask for help, I can imagine an adult feeling the same. My goal is for children, teenagers, and adults, to be able to ask for help and get it. I know there are a lot of good lawyers in the world and I want to be one of those lawyers. I want to be a safety for others and someone that people can depend on when they need to.

Sometimes, it's not the brush with death that leaves the deepest mark—it's the acts of kindness that follow. When I was six years old, I nearly lost my life to Meningitis, a rare condition that causes inflammation of the membranes that surround the spinal cord. The ordeal was terrifying, marked by excruciating pain and a hospital stay that left my parents fearing the worst. As my fragile body lay on a cold unforgiving hospital bed, the only things that provided comfort to me were the warm loving hands of my parents and a small brown teddy bear, compliments of the caring nurses at Tampa General Hospital.

Years later, however, what I remember most vividly from that experience, isn't my first lesson of life's fragility, or the terrifying spinal tap needle being driven into my back, but the lessons of kindness and humanity that awaited me upon my discharge. Arriving home on Thanksgiving Day, after the most frightening week of my young life, our neighbors Bill and Jan Gentry, who were practically strangers to us, arrived at our door with the most beautiful Thanksgiving meal one could imagine. As we received this unexpected gift from our new friends, I was struck by the power that community and compassion could have on a young life.

Later in life I faced another life-threatening experience when I watched my little brother Brooks nearly slip into a coma from Diabetic Ketoacidosis, a serious condition resulting from his undiagnosed Type 1 Diabetes. As he lay in a hospital bed, I witnessed something remarkable: family, friends, and the Type 1 Diabetes community rallying to his aid. They offered not just emotional support, but tangible help, meals, rides, even financial assistance. Their collective strength helped my family navigate that terrifying time and reinforced my belief that we are all deeply interconnected. Ironically, these two traumatizing events have fueled my interest in the most unlikely of professions, politics.

As I've grown and developed a love of current events, I've observed how the tone of our nation has become increasingly bitter and divisive. Politics today often seems more like a battlefield than a forum to help people, with opposing sides more interested in scoring points than in understanding each other. At I write this essay, our nation is one month away from a Presential election, the first one in which I will have the honor to vote. And I while I am anxious to exercise this tremendous privilege, I can't help but feel discouraged by the constant hateful rhetoric, focused on dividing us rather than uniting us. Am I naive to believe there is better way? Reasonable people can disagree with each other, that is to be expected, and while we may never achieve total unity, I believe we should at least strive for empathy and respect. As John F. Kennedy said, "One person can make a difference, and everyone should try."

This belief drives my commitment and volunteering to organizations like the American Diabetes Association and Breakthrough T1D. Through my involvement, I've had the opportunity to connect with others who share my dedication to making the world a more compassionate place. These experiences have not only shaped my character but have also ignited a personal calling: to serve my country in a way that brings decency, community, and kindness back into the political sphere.

The brown teddy bear from my hospital stay is still perched on a shelf in my bedroom, a reminder of the compassion and benevolence that inspired my life's intertest. That bear symbolizes a promise I've made to myself: to always carry forward the lessons of kindness and decency to effect positive change. As I look to the future, I'm determined to bring these values into my work, to be the kind of leader who prioritizes compassion over division. This is my calling, and it's a mission to which I'm ready to dedicate my life.

"What a waste of such an award." I blinked to be certain I was reading the comment section correctly. Ironically, hateful words like these are the ones that have inspired me to become an advocate. Although they were adults, these keyboard warriors reminded me of the kids who bullied me when I came out. I was 12, and no queer kid should experience what I did.

We were in lockdown and I started to find my identity. I started to come out to those close to me but word spread, and I was bullied by my old classmates, their parents, and the school's administration. I was told I was less than.

If I had not felt support from my family and friends, I would likely not be here today. So, I share my story and work to make sure no other little kid will feel the way I did.

"Being a DEI graduate is not a success." Yet another comment on the Assemblymember's Facebook post about me. Being queer is a statement, and I am determined to create safe spaces in my community while fighting for national change. I don't respond to these bullies. I do not need their validation or permission. I continue to fight, upholding the work of those who came before me.

"Her contributions are not important to most struggling youth today." I beg to differ. Whatever the motive, these persistent comments remind me that my work is not done. There may be a perception that California is progressive and advocacy work isn't necessary, but that take is clearly so wrong. Just because the law calls for equality does not mean it feels that way. These comments encourage me to continue, as no amount of hate or abuse can stop pure passion.

I'm proud to provide resources to teachers that will help LGBTQ+ students feel seen at school and to serve on a statewide task force of thirty other stakeholders who volunteer their time to make policy changes. At school, I run the Empowerment for Everyone Club, offering a place for anyone and everyone to be themselves. I'm proud of the work I have done and continue to engage in, and nothing can stop me from speaking out.

My experiences have inspired me to pursue a career focused on helping those whose voices are often diminished. I plan to major in political science, being the first person in my family to apply to college.

I am so excited to learn more about politics in the next few years. Because I have fostered a foundational understanding of this subject in and out of the classroom, through: AP US Government and Politics, an internship with my local Assemblymember, shadowing a LA County Court Superior Judge, working on the California Department of Education's LGBTQ+

Statewide Advisory Task Force and more. I know I am on the right path in pursuing a career in this field because I have enjoyed every aspect of these experiences.

I also got involved in volunteer work that helped me understand how to protect the environment. One of the best experiences was when I worked with the Green Valley Project as a Youth Council Officer. I helped start projects to restore nature, like planting gardens and working on projects to improve the environment around schools in Ventura County. These projects showed me how urban planning can bring nature back to our communities, and I learned that small projects can make a big difference.

In my AP Environmental Science class, we visited places like Steckel Park and the Santa Clara River to learn how to protect wildlife. I saw how we can design cities that protect nature and help animals survive. This made me realize that urban planning can help the planet and create places where people can live and work in healthy environments. I also realized that political decisions can affect how these environmental projects get done. This made me want to learn more about how politics and urban planning work together.

I've also volunteered in other ways that helped me learn about planning and organizing spaces for people. I volunteered at the Ventura County Fair, where I helped set up events and organize activities, especially during livestock shows. I also volunteered at the Limoneira Pumpkin Patch, where I helped with FFA (Future Farmers of America) community service events and made sure the area stayed clean. I learned that well-designed public spaces can make people feel safe and happy, and I want to do this in my future career.

I am hoping to finish my associate's degree in June 2025, and I am excited to start studying urban planning when I go to a 4- year university. I want to learn more and gain new skills that will help me design better cities. My goal is to help design cities that

are good for people and also good for the environment. I want to work on projects that make cities greener, reduce pollution, and create places where people can live in a safe and healthy environment. I also want to learn more about how political science affects these decisions, so I can help make changes that support good urban planning and sustainability.

In college, I want to learn more about urban planning, political science, and how to make cities better for both people and the environment. I hope to work on real projects and learn from experts to gain experience. My goal is to become an urban planner who helps create cities that are good for the environment and for everyone who lives in them, while also using political science to push for the changes that are needed.


